22	<u>(a)</u> The opportunity for an individual to obtain employment
23	for which he is qualified, and to obtain all the accommodations,

advantages, facilities and privileges of any public 1 2 accommodation and of any housing accommodation and commercial 3 property without discrimination because of race, color, familial status, religious creed, ancestry, handicap or disability, age, 4 sex, national origin, the use of a guide or support animal 5 because of the blindness, deafness or physical handicap of the 6 7 user or because the user is a handler or trainer of support or 8 quide animals is hereby recognized as and declared to be a civil right which shall be enforceable as set forth in this act. 9 10 (b) All forms of public transportation shall permit a therapy dog properly harnessed, accompanying a person with a 11 12 disability or an owner or handler of a therapy dog or a person 13 licensed to train therapy dogs, to aid and guide a disabled 14 person and to ride on all vehicles operated for transportation, and no charge shall be made for the transportation of such dog. 15 16 (c) The following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless the context clearly 17 18 indicates otherwise: 19 The term "recognized therapy dog training organization" means 20 any of the following: 21 (1) Pet Partners of Bellevue, Washington; 22 (2) Therapy Dogs Incorporated of Chevenne, Wyoming; 23 (3) Therapy Dogs International of Flanders, New Jersey; 24 (4) Bright and Beautiful Therapy Dogs of Morris Plains, New <u>Jersey;</u> or 25 26 (5) Comfort Caring Canines of Hatfield, Pennsylvania. 27 The term "therapy dog" means any dog that is trained to work or perform specific tasks for the benefit of persons, including 28 29 those with special needs, autism, drug addiction, distress due to emotional and physical abuse and clinical depression or 30

- 2 organization and is actually used for such purpose.
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
