- 1 Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in protection from abuse, further
- providing for arrest for violation of order.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 6113(c) of Title 23 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 6113. Arrest for violation of order.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (c) Procedure following arrest. -- Subsequent to an arrest,
- 11 the defendant shall be taken by the police officer or sheriff
- 12 without unnecessary delay before [the] a court in the judicial
- 13 district where the contempt is alleged to have occurred[. When
- 14 that court is unavailable, the police officer or sheriff shall
- 15 convey the defendant to a magisterial district judge designated
- 16 as appropriate by local rules of court or, in the city of
- 17 Pittsburgh, to a magistrate of the Pittsburgh Magistrates Court
- 18 or, in counties of the first class, to the appropriate hearing

- 1 officer. For purposes of procedure relating to arraignments for
- 2 arrest for violation of an order issued under this chapter, the
- 3 judges of Pittsburgh Magistrates Court shall be deemed to be
- 4 magisterial district judges.] for the purpose of conducting a
- 5 preliminary arraignment. The hearing officer may be a judge or
- 6 magisterial district judge or, in a county of the first class,
- 7 <u>hearing officer</u>.

- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
