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AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in pupils and attendance, further 5 providing for reports of enrollments, attendance and 6 withdrawals and public and private schools. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 1332 of the act of March 10, 1949 11 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, amended January 14, 1970 (1969 P.L.468, No.192), is amended to 12 13 read: 14 Section 1332. Reports of Enrollments; Attendance and Withdrawals; Public and Private Schools .-- (a) Every principal 15 16 or teacher in every public school, and every principal, teacher 17 or tutor in every school other than a public school, and in every institution for children, and every private teacher in 18 every school district, shall[,]: 19

(1) immediately after their admission to such school or

- 1 institution, or at the beginning of such private teaching,
- 2 regardless of whether such admission is prior to the first day
- 3 of the school district's school year or at any time thereafter,
- 4 furnish to the district superintendents, attendance officers,
- 5 home and school visitors, or secretaries of the boards of school
- 6 directors of the districts wherein the [parents or guardians of
- 7 such children] parent, quardian or other person having control
- 8 or charge of any child or children of compulsory school age
- 9 reside, lists of the names and residences of all children
- 10 [between six (6) and] under eighteen (18) years of age enrolled
- 11 in such school or institution, or taught by such private
- 12 teachers; [and]
- 13 (2) shall further report at once to such district
- 14 superintendent, or secretary of the board of school directors,
- 15 the name and date of withdrawal of any such pupil withdrawing
- 16 from any such school or institution, or from such private
- 17 instruction, if such withdrawal occurs during the period of
- 18 compulsory attendance in said district[.]; and
- 19 (3) shall further report at the end of each reporting period
- 20 to such district superintendent, or secretary of the board of
- 21 school directors, the total number of such end of reporting
- 22 period progress reports, whether by report card or otherwise,
- 23 that were issued to its students.
- 24 (b) Every principal or teacher in a school other than a
- 25 public school, and every private teacher, shall also report at
- 26 once to the superintendent, attendance officer, home and school
- 27 visitor, or secretary of the board of school directors of the
- 28 district, any such child who has been absent three (3) days, or
- 29 their equivalent, during the term of compulsory attendance,
- 30 without lawful excuse.

- 1 (c) (1) Pursuant to the requirements of 22 Pa. Code 11.41
- 2 (relating to school district policies and rules), the board of
- 3 <u>school directors shall formally adopt, as part of its written</u>
- 4 rules concerning district child accounting, attendance and
- 5 <u>admission</u>, a policy for providing the parent, quardian or other
- 6 person having control or charge of any child of compulsory
- 7 school age an opportunity to update residence and contact
- 8 <u>information that is recorded in the student record of the child.</u>
- 9 (2) The policy shall include, at a minimum, a process to
- 10 periodically request throughout the school year the residence of
- 11 the child and all contact information of the parent, guardian or
- 12 other such person with control or charge of the child that shall
- 13 occur when each report on the child's progress or level of
- 14 <u>achievement in specific classes, course content or curriculum is</u>
- 15 <u>issued</u>, whether by report card or otherwise, unless the
- 16 reporting periods are less than three (3) times a school year or
- 17 exceed four (4) times a school year.
- 18 (3) If the reporting periods are less than three (3) times a
- 19 school year or exceed four (4) times a school year, the policy
- 20 shall require a process of request that occurs every sixty (60)
- 21 days of the school year that provides the parent, guardian or
- 22 other such person with control or charge of the child the
- 23 opportunity to update the contact information and the child's
- 24 residence.
- 25 (d) (1) On the first day of each school year, the district
- 26 superintendents, attendance officers, home and school visitors
- 27 <u>or secretaries of the boards of school directors of the</u>
- 28 districts with the list of names furnished to them pursuant to
- 29 <u>subsection (a)(1) and (2) shall total the number of students</u>
- 30 enrolled for the school year in each such school in the

- 1 district. The total number of students recorded shall
- 2 immediately be reported to the department listed in the form of
- 3 the total enrollment for each individual such school and the
- 4 <u>cumulative total for the school district.</u>
- 5 (2) Starting at the end of the first reporting period of the
- 6 school year and at the end of each such subsequent reporting
- 7 period thereafter until the final reporting period of the school
- 8 year occurs, the district superintendents, attendance officers,
- 9 <u>home and school visitors or secretaries of the boards of school</u>
- 10 directors of the districts at any district with reporting
- 11 periods that occur three (3) times or four (4) times a school
- 12 year, whether by report card or otherwise, shall:
- (i) review all the lists of names furnished to them under
- 14 <u>subsection (a)(1) and (2), to recalculate and record the total</u>
- 15 <u>number of students enrolled in each such school in the district</u>,
- 16 as well as recalculate the cumulative total of the school
- 17 district as of the date of recalculation;
- 18 (ii) compare the total number of end of reporting period
- 19 progress reports most recently issued and furnished pursuant to
- 20 subsection (a) (3) to the total recorded enrollment numbers in
- 21 subclause (i) for each respective school, for the purpose of
- 22 counting and recording any difference between the two numbers in
- 23 <u>each such school; and</u>
- 24 (iii) report to the department immediately whenever there
- 25 are differences recorded in subclause (ii), to be listed in the
- 26 form of the total number of differences for each individual such
- 27 school with an explanation of the difference, and further,
- 28 whenever any recalculated numbers of enrollment recorded in
- 29 subclause (i) have changed from the number last reported in the
- 30 school year to the department, whether calculated and reported

- 1 pursuant to clause (1) or subclause (i), to be listed in the
- 2 form of the total enrollment numbers that were recorded in
- 3 subclause (i) for each individual such school and the cumulative
- 4 total for the school district with a notation of the difference
- 5 in amount enrolled.
- 6 (3) In the event that the reporting period is less than
- 7 three (3) times a school year or exceeds four (4) times a school
- 8 year, the district superintendents, attendance officers, home
- 9 and school visitors or secretaries of the boards of school
- 10 directors of the districts shall perform the requirements set
- 11 forth in clause (2)(i), (ii) and (iii) sixty (60) days after the
- 12 <u>first day of the school year and every sixty (60) days</u>
- 13 thereafter until the last day of the school year.
- 14 (4) Within thirty (30) days after the last day of each
- 15 school year, the district superintendents, attendance officers,
- 16 home and school visitors or secretaries of the boards of school
- 17 directors of the districts shall determine from the list of
- 18 names and residences furnished to them in subsection (a) (1) and
- 19 the name and date of withdrawal of any such pupil withdrawing
- 20 furnished to them in subsection (a) (2) for the purpose of
- 21 recording:
- 22 (i) the total number of students who left any such school in
- 23 the school district during the school year without transferring
- 24 to any other such school in the school district; and
- 25 (ii) the total number of students who transferred between
- 26 schools which are assigned to the same school or system leader,
- 27 whether public or not public, or between like institutions or
- 28 private instruction, within the school district during the
- 29 school year with a tally provided of the number of transfers
- 30 that were between two public schools, were transfers into public

- 1 <u>schools or were transfers out of public schools.</u>
- 2 (5) The numbers recorded under clause (4)(i) and (ii) shall
- 3 be reported to the department within thirty (30) days of the
- 4 <u>last day of the school year.</u>
- 5 (e) For the purpose of this section, the following words and
- 6 phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection
- 7 <u>unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 8 "Contact information" shall mean the address, telephone
- 9 <u>number, e-mail address or any other available electronic means</u>
- 10 of communication of the parent, quardian or other such person
- 11 with control or charge of the child of compulsory school age and
- 12 is subject to further definition by any individual board of
- 13 school directors to include the identification of additional
- 14 <u>similar type of information as needed.</u>
- 15 "Department" shall mean the Department of Education of the
- 16 Commonwealth.
- 17 "Reporting period" shall mean the repeated cycle of days that
- 18 the child's progress or level of achievement in specific
- 19 classes, course content or curriculum is assessed for the
- 20 purpose of issuing an account thereof at the end of such cycle
- 21 to the parent, quardian or other such person with control or
- 22 charge of the child of compulsory school age.
- "School" shall mean every public school, every school other
- 24 than a public school, every institution for children and every
- 25 teacher of private instruction in every school district subject
- 26 to this section.
- 27 "School year" shall mean the period within the fiscal year of
- 28 July 1 to June 30 of at least one hundred eighty (180)
- 29 instructional days or, if approved by the secretary, a period of
- 30 less than one hundred eighty (180) instructional days in which a

- 1 meritorious educational program of at least nine hundred (900)
- 2 hours at the elementary level and nine hundred ninety (990)
- 3 hours at the secondary level is offered.
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
