1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending Title 74 (Transportation) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in turnpike, providing for tunnel maintenance and inspection and further providing for electronic toll collection; and, in Turnpike Commission standards of conduct, further providing for qualifications, restrictions and duties of commission members and employees.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Title 74 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
10	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
11	§ 8107.1. Tunnel maintenance and inspection.
12	(a) Duties of commission The commission shall:
13	(1) On or before December 31, 2017, install video
14	cameras in tunnels that do not have video monitoring
15	capability.
16	(2) On or before December 31, 2017, install fire
17	detection and suppression systems in tunnels that do not have
18	such detection systems.
19	(3) Ensure that each tunnel undergoes a routine
20	inspection biennially in accordance with commission

- 1 quidelines and Federal Highway Administration regulations.
- 2 (4) Expand the development and deployment of a tunnel
- 3 <u>management tracking system so that all tunnel inspection</u>
- 4 <u>recommendations and their implementation status are available</u>
- 5 through the database.
- 6 (b) Tunnel Management Committee. -- The commission's chief
- 7 operating officer shall convene a multidepartmental Tunnel
- 8 Management Committee, which shall include, at a minimum, the
- 9 <u>departments of engineering</u>, maintenance, facilities and energy
- 10 management and traffic engineering and operations for
- 11 <u>information regarding tunnel inspection and safety issues. The</u>
- 12 <u>Tunnel Management Committee members shall select a chairperson</u>
- 13 from among its members who shall serve as the single point of
- 14 <u>contact for tunnel safety concerns.</u>
- 15 Section 2. Section 8117 of Title 74 is amended by adding a
- 16 subsection to read:
- 17 § 8117. Electronic toll collection.

- 19 (d.1) Customer service. -- An entity that enters into a
- 20 contract with the commission to operate or maintain electronic
- 21 toll collection shall provide telephone access to the entity's
- 22 <u>customer service center during normal business hours and extend</u>
- 23 its hours of operation beyond normal business hours at least one
- 24 <u>day a week.</u>

- Section 3. Section 8203(a)(3) of Title 74 is amended and the
- 27 section is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 28 § 8203. Qualifications, restrictions and duties of commission
- members and employees.
- 30 (a) General rule. -- The following qualifications and

1	restrictions shall apply to members and executive-level
2	employees:
3	* * *
4	(3) (i) No member or executive-level employee shall be
5	paid or receive any fee or other compensation other than
6	salary and actual and necessary traveling expenses
7	provided by law and as limited by commission policy for
8	any activity directly pertaining to the duties of the
9	commission. A member may be reimbursed for an expense
10	that exceeds commission limits only upon submission of:
11	(A) an adequate explanation or justification of
12	the appropriateness of the expense incurred; and
13	(B) a receipt documenting the expense incurred.
14	(ii) Any cellular device or other electronic
15	equipment for member use must be purchased through the
16	commission's purchasing office. A member who purchases a
17	cellular device or other electronic equipment is not
18	entitled to reimbursement for the device or equipment.
19	(iii) The commission shall post on its publicly
20	accessible Internet website monthly reports detailing
21	member expenses.
22	[(ii)] <u>(iv)</u> Nothing in this chapter shall be
23	construed to prohibit a member or executive-level
24	employee from engaging in any employment or vocation that
25	is not incompatible with service as a member or
26	executive-level employee.

28	(c) Travel on turnpike The following applies to toll-free
29	access to and travel on the turnpike:
30	(1) The commission may authorize toll-free access to and

Τ	travel on the turnpike:
2	(i) When access to and travel on the turnpike is
3	required by any of the following who are engaged in
4	employment-related activity and only for the duration of
5	the activity:
6	(A) Commission members and employees.
7	(B) Contractors, subcontractors, consultants and
8	subconsultants of the commission.
9	(C) Concessionaires.
10	(D) Authorized service providers.
11	(E) Emergency service responders.
12	(ii) When access to and travel on the turnpike is
13	required by government agencies and entities that are
14	conducting official commission business and only for the
15	duration of the conduct of the business.
16	(2) Toll-free access to and travel on the turnpike by
17	individuals for personal travel is prohibited.
18	(3) The commission shall:
19	(i) Monitor toll-free access to and travel on the
20	turnpike, including access and travel by persons not
21	employed by the commission, to ensure compliance with any
22	trust indenture.
23	(ii) Ensure its nonrevenue identification cards
24	include a photograph of the individual to whom the card
25	is issued.
26	(iii) Post on its publicly accessible Internet
27	website quarterly usage reports of toll-free turnpike
28	travel, including usage by persons listed under paragraph
29	<u>(1).</u>
30	Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
