4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania	
5	hereby enacts as follows:

1	§ 7201. Scope of chapter.
2	This chapter relates to private employer's veterans'
3	preference policies.
4	§ 7202. Legislative findings.
5	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
6	(1) The Commonwealth has a moral duty and obligation to
7	provide for and assist its military personnel and veterans,
8	including new veterans returning from deployment in United
9	States military operations in places such as Iraq and
10	<u>Afghanistan.</u>
11	(2) According to a 2014 annual report by the United
12	States Bureau of Labor Statistics, this Commonwealth has an
13	unemployment rate of 4.7% for veterans, while 44.3% of
14	veterans were employed, which trailed the national average of
15	47.9%.
16	(3) While the Commonwealth offers veterans' preference
17	in public employment, a similar preference does not exist for
18	<u>private employers.</u>
19	(4) Twenty states have enacted legislation authorizing a
20	veterans' preference by private employers. The Commonwealth
21	should follow this emerging trend.
22	(5) Many states that have enacted similar legislation
23	have lower veteran unemployment rates and higher percentages
24	of employed veterans than this Commonwealth.
25	(6) The Commonwealth has a duty to help ease the
26	transition back to society for veterans, and allowing private
27	businesses to apply a veterans' preference employment policy
28	would assist more veterans in obtaining employment.
29	§ 7203 7202. Definitions.
30	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

- 1 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 2 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 3 "DD 214." A United States Department of Defense Report of
- 4 Separation Form 214 or a similarly effective form issued by the
- 5 Department of Defense relating to separation from military
- 6 <u>service.</u>
- 7 <u>"Private employer." A sole proprietor, corporation,</u>
- 8 partnership, limited liability company or any other legal
- 9 <u>entity</u>, <u>including nonprofits</u>, <u>with more than one employee</u>.
- 10 "SOLDIER." A PERSON WHO SERVED OR HEREAFTER SERVES IN THE
- 11 ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, OR IN ANY WOMEN'S
- 12 ORGANIZATION OFFICIALLY CONNECTED THEREWITH, DURING ANY WAR OR
- 13 ARMED CONFLICT IN WHICH THE UNITED STATES ENGAGED AND WHO WAS
- 14 RELEASED FROM ACTIVE DUTY UNDER HONORABLE CONDITIONS, OTHER THAN
- 15 FROM PERIODS OF ACTIVE DUTY FOR TRAINING, OR WITH AN HONORABLE
- 16 DISCHARGE FROM SUCH SERVICE, OR A PERSON WHO SO SERVED OR
- 17 HEREAFTER SERVES IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, OR IN
- 18 ANY WOMEN'S ORGANIZATION OFFICIALLY CONNECTED THEREWITH, SINCE
- 19 JULY 27, 1953, INCLUDING SERVICE IN VIETNAM, AND WHO HAS AN
- 20 HONORABLE DISCHARGE FROM SUCH SERVICE. QUALIFYING PERIODS OF
- 21 SERVICE DURING A WAR OR ARMED CONFLICT, FOR PURPOSES OF THIS
- 22 DEFINITION, WILL BE DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND
- 23 VETERANS AFFAIRS.
- 24 "Spouse of a disabled veteran." The spouse of a veteran who
- 25 has been classified by the United States Department of Veterans
- 26 Affairs' Veterans Benefits Administration as having a permanent
- 27 total disability and is a United States citizen.
- 28 "Surviving spouse." A spouse of a deceased veteran who is <-
- 29 <u>married to the veteran prior to or on the effective date of this</u>
- 30 section and who is a United States citizen SOLDIER.

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1	"Veteran." An individual who served in any of the following <
2	and was released under honorable conditions:
3	(1) the United States Armed Forces;
4	(2) any women's organization officially connected with
5	the United States Armed Forces; or
6	(3) the Pennsylvania National Guard. AN INDIVIDUAL WHO <
7	HAS SERVED IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES,
8	INCLUDING A RESERVE COMPONENT AND NATIONAL GUARD, AND WHO HAS
9	BEEN DISCHARGED OR RELEASED FROM THE SERVICE UNDER CONDITIONS
10	OTHER THAN DISHONORABLE.
11	"Veterans' preference employment policy." A voluntary policy
12	adopted by a private employer for hiring, promoting or retaining
13	a veteran, a spouse of a disabled veteran or a surviving spouse
14	over another qualified applicant or employee.
15	§ 7204 7203. Veterans' preference private employment policy.
16	(a) AuthorityA private employer may adopt and apply a
17	veterans' employment policy.
18	(b) Policy A veterans' preference employment policy shall:
19	(1) be in writing;
20	(2) require the inclusion of a statement in any job
21	posting that indicates that the employer has and applies a
22	veterans' preference employment policy;
23	(3) be provided to the applicant at time of hiring and
24	provided to all employees on an annual basis; and
25	(4) be applied uniformly to employment decisions
26	regarding:
27	(i) the hiring of new applicants;
28	(ii) the promotion of current employees; and
29	(iii) the retention of employees during a reduction
3 0	in the workforce

- 1 § 7205 7204. Eligibility for preference.
- 2 A veteran, spouse of a disabled veteran or surviving spouse

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- 3 shall submit the DD 214 of the veteran to a private employer
- 4 with a veterans' preference employment policy for consideration
- 5 by the employer.
- 6 § 7206 7205. Nonviolation of equal opportunity laws.
- 7 A voluntary veterans' preference employment policy adopted
- 8 and applied in accordance with this chapter shall not be
- 9 <u>considered a violation of any State or local equal employment</u>
- 10 opportunity law.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
