AN ACT

1 Amending the act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39),
2 entitled "An act establishing salaries and compensation of
3 certain public officials including justices and judges of
4 Statewide courts, judges of courts of common pleas, judges of
5 the Philadelphia Municipal Court, judges of the Philadelphia
6 Traffic Court, district justices and the Governor, the
7 Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor
8 General, the Attorney General and certain other State
9 officers and the salary and certain expenses of the members
10 of the General Assembly; and repealing certain inconsistent
11 acts," further providing for judicial salaries, for
12 compensation of Governor and Lieutenant Governor, State
13 Treasurer, Auditor General, Attorney General, Commissioners
14 of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, and heads of
15 departments and for suspension of compensation.

16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
17 hereby enacts as follows:

18 Section 1. Sections 2.1(f) and 3(a) of the act of September
19 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39), known as the Public Official
20 Compensation Law, reenacted and amended November 16, 2005
21 (P.L.385, No.72), are amended to read:

22 Section 2.1. Judicial salaries.

23 * * *

24 [(f) Philadelphia Traffic Court.--The President Judge of the
25 Philadelphia Traffic Court shall receive an annual salary of

1 \$55,000. The annual salary for the other judges of the
2 Philadelphia Traffic Court shall be \$54,500.]

3 * * *

4 Section 3. Compensation of Governor and Lieutenant Governor;
5 State Treasurer; Auditor General; Attorney General;
6 Commissioners of the Pennsylvania Public Utility
7 Commission; and heads of departments.

8 (a) The Governor, the Lieutenant Governor and Cabinet.--The
9 annual salaries of the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor and the
10 heads of the departments shall be as follows: Governor,
11 \$125,000; Lieutenant Governor, \$105,000; Adjutant General,
12 \$90,000; Secretary of Aging, \$95,000; Secretary of Agriculture,
13 \$90,000; Secretary of Banking, \$90,000; Secretary of the Budget,
14 \$100,000; Secretary of Community and Economic Development,
15 \$95,000; Secretary of the Commonwealth, \$90,000; Secretary of
16 Education, \$100,000; Secretary of Environmental Protection,
17 \$100,000; Secretary of General Services, \$95,000; Secretary of
18 Health, \$100,000; Insurance Commissioner, \$90,000; Secretary of
19 Labor and Industry, \$100,000; Secretary of Public Welfare,
20 \$100,000; Secretary of Revenue, \$95,000; State Police
21 Commissioner, \$95,000; Secretary of Transportation, \$100,000;
22 Secretary of Corrections, \$100,000; Secretary of Conservation
23 and Natural Resources \$95,000.

25 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
26 Section 5.3. Suspension of compensation.

27 If a general appropriation bill fails to be enacted in full
28 by July 1 for that fiscal year, the Governor, Lieutenant
29 Governor, heads of departments and members of the General
30 Assembly may not receive any compensation, including salary and

1 expense reimbursement, until the following occurs:

2 (1) The General Assembly passes a general appropriation
3 bill for the full fiscal year; and

4 (2) The Governor signs the bill or the bill otherwise
5 becomes law.

6 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
