AN ACT Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for the recall election of 2 elected officials. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 65 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read: 8 CHAPTER 14 9 RECALL ELECTION 10 Sec. 11 1401. Definitions. 1402. Sole grounds for recall. 12 13 1403. Recall election proceedings. 1404. Recall election. 14 15 1405. Rules and regulations. 16 § 1401. Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 "Challenger." A candidate to replace a recalled elected
- 2 official, who may not himself be an elected official subject to
- 3 recall.
- 4 <u>"General appropriation bill." The bill that includes the</u>
- 5 yearly appropriations for the Commonwealth, as required under
- 6 section 11 of Article III of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.
- 7 § 1402. Sole grounds for recall.
- 8 <u>In accordance with section 18 of Article II of the</u>
- 9 Constitution of Pennsylvania, the Governor, Lieutenant Governor
- 10 and each member of the General Assembly shall be subject to
- 11 recall by the voters of this Commonwealth or the political
- 12 <u>subdivision from which the public official was elected if a</u>
- 13 general appropriation bill is not signed into law by 11:59 p.m.
- 14 <u>on December 31 after the beginning of a fiscal year.</u>
- 15 § 1403. Recall election proceedings.
- 16 <u>(a) Suspension prohibited.--If a general appropriation bill</u>
- 17 is not signed into law by 11:59 p.m. on December 31 after the
- 18 beginning of a fiscal year, the recall election under section
- 19 1404 (relating to recall election) is automatically initiated
- 20 and may not be suspended or canceled even if a general
- 21 appropriation bill is subsequently enacted for that fiscal year.
- 22 (b) Leaving office.--Each recalled official shall leave
- 23 office on the fourth Tuesday following the runoff election. The
- 24 unsuccessful incumbent in the election shall leave office on the
- 25 fourth Tuesday following the election.
- 26 (c) Governor. -- A recalled Governor may not issue any
- 27 <u>executive order or make any appointment subject to Senate</u>
- 28 confirmation between the date of the recall election and the
- 29 runoff election or, if he loses the runoff election, between the
- 30 date of the runoff and the date of leaving office.

- 1 § 1404. Recall election.
- 2 (a) Date of election. -- The recall election shall occur on
- 3 the same date as the following primary election day. Petitions
- 4 to appear on a recall ballot as a challenger shall be conducted
- 5 in the manner provided under the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333,
- 6 No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code.
- 7 (b) Ballot. -- The following shall apply:
- 8 (1) The ballot shall ask if the elector would like to
- 9 <u>recall the appropriate elected officials. If the elector</u>
- 10 <u>chooses yes, the elector will then place a vote for his</u>
- desired candidates among the challengers.
- 12 (2) The required number of votes to recall an elected
- official shall be 50% of the total votes plus one vote.
- 14 (c) Runoff election. -- If no single candidate receives the
- 15 majority of votes required under subsection (b) (2), the top
- 16 challengers whose combined votes total at least 50% of the total
- 17 votes cast shall participate in a runoff election. The runoff
- 18 election shall occur on the fourth Tuesday following the recall
- 19 election.
- 20 (d) Governor and Lieutenant Governor. -- The Governor and
- 21 Lieutenant Governor and the challengers for the governorship
- 22 shall appear on a single recall election ballot. If the
- 23 incumbent Governor is successfully recalled, he and the
- 24 incumbent Lieutenant Governor shall be subject to section
- 25 1403(b) (relating to recall election proceedings). The newly
- 26 elected Governor shall select a Lieutenant Governor within 30
- 27 days, who shall be confirmed by a three-fourths majority of the
- 28 Senate and the House of Representatives before taking office.
- 29 § 1405. Rules and regulations.
- 30 The Secretary of the Commonwealth may promulgate rules and

- 1 regulations necessary to administer this chapter.
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
