14	Section 1. Section 1.1 of the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242,
15	No.86), referred to as the Cosmetology Law, added June 30, 1984
16	(P.L.479, No.100) is amended to read:
17	Section 1.1. Membership of Board(a) The board shall
18	consist of [thirteen] <u>nine</u> members: [the Commissioner of
19	Professional and Occupational Affairs; the Director of the
20	Bureau of Consumer Protection in the Office of Attorney General,
21	or his designee; three public members appointed by the Governor
22	with the advice and consent of the Senate, which members shall

represent the public at large; and eight professional members 1 appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the 2 Senate, which members have had at least five years practical 3 4 and/or managerial experience in the majority of the practices of cosmetology and shall be actively engaged in the profession.] 5 6 four members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate, one member appointed by the President pro_ 7 tempore of the Senate, one member appointed by the Minority 8 9 Leader of the Senate, one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one member appointed by the Majority_ 10 11 Leader of the House of Representatives and one member appointed 12 by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives. No [more than one professional] member shall be currently employed as a 13 14 vocational education teacher of cosmetology in the public 15 schools. No more than two [professional] members of the board shall be currently affiliated with a private school of 16 17 cosmetology. No other person who has been affiliated with a 18 private cosmetology school within three years prior to 19 nomination may be nominated. Members currently serving on the 20 board shall continue to serve until the expiration of their terms and until successors are appointed and qualified according 21 22 to law, but for no longer than six months.

23 [Professional and public members appointed after the (b) 24 expiration of the terms of current board members shall serve the 25 following terms: two professional members and one public member 26 shall serve one year; two professional members and one public 27 member shall serve two years; and two professional members and 28 one public member shall serve three years. Thereafter, 29 professional and public members] Members shall serve three-year 30 terms. No member may serve more than two consecutive terms.

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(c) [Seven] <u>Five</u> members of the board shall constitute a
quorum. The board shall select, from among their number, a
chairman, a vice chairman and a secretary.

4 (d) Each [public and professional] member of the board shall 5 be paid reasonable traveling, hotel and other necessary expenses 6 and per diem compensation at the rate of sixty dollars (\$60) for 7 each day of actual service while on board business.

8 (e) A member who fails to attend three consecutive meetings 9 shall forfeit his seat unless the Commissioner of Professional 10 and Occupational Affairs, upon written request from the member, 11 finds that the member should be excused from a meeting because 12 of illness or the death of an immediate family member.

(f) In the event that a member of the board dies or resigns during the term of office, a successor shall be appointed in the same way and with the same qualifications as set forth in subsections (a) and (b) and shall hold office for the unexpired term.

18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
