## AN ACT

- 1 Authorizing the Department of Transportation to erect fencing on certain State-owned bridges.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Bridge
- 7 Fencing Safety Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Bridge." A State-owned, new or existing bridge under the
- 13 jurisdiction of the department.
- 14 "Department." The Department of Transportation of the
- 15 Commonwealth.
- "Limited access highway." As defined in 75 Pa.C.S. § 102
- 17 (relating to definitions).
- 18 Section 3. Bridges over interstate and other limited access

- 1 highways.
- 2 (a) Bridges with sidewalks. -- When a bridge is built with a
- 3 sidewalk or when a concrete barrier is installed, modified or
- 4 rehabilitated on a bridge with a sidewalk over an interstate or
- 5 other limited access highway, the department shall install
- 6 protective fencing.
- 7 (b) Bridges without sidewalks. -- When a bridge is built
- 8 without a sidewalk or when a concrete barrier is installed,
- 9 modified or rehabilitated on a bridge without a sidewalk over an
- 10 interstate or other limited access highway, the department, as
- 11 part of its preliminary design process, shall consider
- 12 protective fencing at all of the following locations:
- 13 (1) On an overpass near a school, playground or other
- site where it would be expected that the overpass would be
- 15 frequently used by children.
- 16 (2) On an overpass in an urban area used exclusively by
- 17 pedestrians and not easily kept under surveillance by police.
- 18 (3) On an overpass where experience relating to nearby
- 19 structures indicates a need for protective fencing.
- 20 (4) On an overpass where there have been incidents of
- 21 objects being dropped or thrown from the overpass and where
- increased surveillance, warning signs or apprehension of
- offenders has not effectively alleviated the problem.
- 24 (c) Exceptions. -- The provisions of subsection (a) shall not
- 25 apply if:
- 26 (1) a protective barrier is required on the bridge; or
- 27 (2) the fencing would obstruct scenic views of the area
- and the local government for the municipality in which the
- 29 bridge is located:
- 30 (i) decides that fencing must not be placed on the

- bridge;
- 2 (ii) provides a statement to the department that
- 3 there have been no incidents of objects being dropped
- 4 from the bridge onto traffic; and
- 5 (iii) agrees that local law enforcement will monitor
- 6 the bridge.
- 7 Section 4. Bridges over nonlimited access highways.
- 8 The department, as part of its preliminary design process,
- 9 shall consider protective fencing at all of the following
- 10 locations on bridges over nonlimited access highways:
- 11 (1) On an overpass near a school, playground or other
- 12 site where it would be expected that the overpass would be
- frequently used by children.
- 14 (2) On an overpass in an urban area used exclusively by
- pedestrians and not easily kept under surveillance by police.
- 16 (3) On an overpass with a sidewalk, where experience
- 17 relating to nearby structures indicates a need for protective
- 18 fencing.
- 19 (4) On an overpass where there have been incidents of
- 20 objects being dropped or thrown from the overpass and where
- 21 increased surveillance, warning signs or apprehension of
- offenders has not effectively alleviated the problem.
- 23 Section 5. Effective date.
- 24 This act shall take effect immediately.
