A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of April 19 through 25, 2015, as "Pennsylvania Family Center Network Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania Family Centers are early childhood,
- 4 parent education and family support programs serving families
- 5 throughout pregnancy until children enter school; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Family centers promote the protective factors that
- 7 keep families strong by increasing parent knowledge and
- 8 practices, providing early detection of developmental delays and
- 9 health issues, preventing child abuse and neglect, meeting
- 10 concrete needs, increasing children's school readiness and
- 11 school success, connecting families with each other and
- 12 increasing family involvement and leadership in the community;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, All young children and their families deserve the
- 15 same opportunities to succeed regardless of any demographic,
- 16 geographic or economic considerations; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Family center services are tailored to the resources

- 1 and needs of the communities served; and
- WHEREAS, Family centers serve 4,733 families with 6,843
- 3 children enrolled in the Parents as Teachers (PAT) home visiting
- 4 program and hundreds more families with supportive services; and
- 5 WHEREAS, PAT is the evidence-based program used by all
- 6 Pennsylvania Family Centers; and
- 7 WHEREAS, PAT's vision is that all children will earn, grow
- 8 and develop to reach their full potential and
- 9 WHEREAS, PAT's mission is to provide the information, support
- 10 and encouragement parents need to help children develop
- 11 optimally during the crucial early years of life; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Family centers affirm PAT's position that parents
- 13 are children's first and most influential teachers, and the
- 14 early years of life are critical for optimal development and
- 15 provide the foundation for success in school and life; and
- 16 WHEREAS, PAT is federally recognized as an evidence-based
- 17 model program because it meets rigorous standards for
- 18 effectiveness; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Family centers support families in achieving
- 20 economic stability, healthy children in healthy homes and school
- 21 readiness of children through strength-based work with families,
- 22 including the use of the PAT's model; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth invests more than \$3 million in
- 24 family centers; and
- WHEREAS, More than 60% of Pennsylvania's population lives in
- 26 the 28 counties served by family centers in urban, rural and
- 27 suburban communities; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Sixty-five percent of the families served are
- 29 considered high risk due to low educational attainment, poverty
- 30 or disability; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Established and emerging research should be the
- 2 foundation of parent education and family support curricula,
- 3 training, materials and services; therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of April 19
- 5 through 25, 2015, as "Pennsylvania Family Center Network Week"
- 6 in Pennsylvania.
