A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the 25th anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act on July 26, 2015.
- 3 WHEREAS, The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was signed
- 4 into law on July 26, 1990, by President George H. W. Bush; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The ADA is one of America's most important pieces of
- 6 legislation prohibiting discrimination; and
- WHEREAS, The purpose of the ADA is to ensure that people with
- 8 disabilities enjoy the same rights and opportunities as everyone
- 9 else; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The ADA prohibits discrimination against individuals
- 11 with disabilities in all areas of public life; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 2013, an estimated 12.8% of all Americans
- 13 reported having a disability; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In Pennsylvania, that number increased to an
- 15 estimated 13.4%; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Of those estimated 12.8% of Americans with a

- 1 disability, an estimated 34.5% were employed in 2013; and
- 2 WHEREAS, In Pennsylvania, the number of employed individuals
- 3 with a disability decreased to an estimated 33.6%; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Of those individuals with a disability in
- 5 Pennsylvania, an estimated 29.8% were living below the poverty
- 6 line in 2013; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Despite the significant benefits of the ADA, the
- 8 high rates of unemployment and individuals living below the
- 9 poverty line demonstrate that significant barriers still exist
- 10 for people living with disabilities; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the 25th anniversary of
- 12 the Americans with Disabilities Act on July 26, 2015.
