## A RESOLUTION

Urging the Department of Labor to recognize Pennsylvania's 1 noncompliance with revised standards for apprenticeship 2 programs and take actions to decertify Pennsylvania's State 3 Apprenticeship Council. 5 WHEREAS, Apprenticeship is a valuable system for work force development and job creation; and 6 7 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State Apprenticeship and Training 8 Council was created by the Apprenticeship and Training Act; and 9 WHEREAS, The Apprenticeship and Training Act establishes as 10 one of the duties of the Pennsylvania State Apprenticeship and 11 Training Council "to encourage the development of an apprenticeship and training system through the voluntary 12 cooperation of management and labor and interested State 13 agencies and in cooperation with other states and the Federal 14 15 Government"; and 16 WHEREAS, The Department of Labor established revised

standards for apprenticeship through 29 CFR Part 29 on October

29, 2008; and

- 1 WHEREAS, These revised standards increase flexibility,
- 2 enhance program quality and accountability and promote
- 3 apprenticeship opportunity in the 21st century, while continuing
- 4 to safeguard the welfare of apprentices; and
- 5 WHEREAS, It is the responsibility of the Department of Labor
- 6 to provide sufficient resources to states to ensure outreach and
- 7 education, registration of programs and apprentices, provision
- 8 of technical assistance and monitoring; and
- 9 WHEREAS, States that comply with these revised standards must
- 10 submit a state apprenticeship law, instituted through statute,
- 11 Executive Order, regulation or other means, that conforms to the
- 12 requirements of 29 CFR Parts 29 and 30; and
- 13 WHEREAS, One of the basic requirements for compliance and
- 14 recognition by the Department of Labor is the establishment and
- 15 maintenance of a State Apprenticeship Agency; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The provisions of 29 CFR Part 29 provide a two-year
- 17 period for states to comply with the revised regulations, which
- 18 time period expired on December 29, 2010; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has not established and does not
- 20 maintain a State Apprenticeship Agency; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Revised Federal standards extend decision-making
- 22 recognition only to State Apprenticeship Agencies because State
- 23 Apprenticeship Council members are ultimately not accountable to
- 24 the Commonwealth or the Department of Labor and Industry for
- 25 their actions; therefore be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 27 urge the Department of Labor to formally recognize
- 28 Pennsylvania's noncompliance with standards established in 29
- 29 CFR Part 29 and, as such, implement derecognition proceedings
- 30 against the Department of Labor and Industry; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That compliance with these standards is a required
- 2 component for Federal acknowledgment of the decision-making
- 3 ability of the Pennsylvania State Apprenticeship and Training
- 4 Council; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with 29 CFR § 29.14, "the
- 6 recognition for Federal purposes of a State Apprenticeship
- 7 Agency may be withdrawn for the failure to fulfill, or operate
- 8 in conformity with, the requirements of "29 CFR Pt. 29; and be
- 9 it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 11 the President of the United States, the Secretary of the United
- 12 States Department of Labor, the presiding officers of each house
- 13 of Congress and to each member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
