A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of November 2016 as "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, In 2016, an estimated 46,420 people will be
- 4 diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States and 39,590
- 5 people will die from the disease; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Pancreatic cancer, one of the deadliest cancers, is
- 7 currently the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United
- 8 States and is projected to become the second deadliest cancer by
- 9 2020; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Pancreatic cancer is the only major cancer with a
- 11 five-year relative survival rate in the single digits at just
- 12 6%; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Pancreatic cancer symptoms generally present late
- 14 stage and 73% of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first
- 15 year of their diagnosis, while 94% of pancreatic cancer patients
- 16 die within the first five years; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Approximately 1,990 deaths caused by pancreatic
- 2 cancer will occur in Pennsylvania in 2016; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Federal Recalcitrant Cancer Research Act of 2012
- 4 directs the National Cancer Institute to develop a scientific
- 5 framework or strategic plan to fight pancreatic cancer and other
- 6 deadly cancers; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is the national
- 8 organization serving the pancreatic cancer community in
- 9 Pennsylvania and nationwide through a comprehensive approach
- 10 that includes public policy, research funding, patient services
- 11 and public awareness and education related to developing
- 12 effective treatments and a cure for pancreatic cancer; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Pancreatic Cancer Action Network and its
- 14 affiliates in this Commonwealth support those patients currently
- 15 battling pancreatic cancer and are committed to nothing less
- 16 than a cure; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The health and well-being of the residents of this
- 18 Commonwealth are enhanced as a direct result of increased
- 19 awareness about pancreatic cancer and research into early
- 20 detection, causes and effective treatments; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of November
- 22 2016 as "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
