A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth
- of Pennsylvania, in taxation and finance, providing for
- spending limitations on the Commonwealth.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby resolves as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 7 Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
- 8 That Article VIII be amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 18. Spending limitations.
- 10 (a) Total spending by the Commonwealth shall not exceed the
- 11 spending limit in any fiscal year. The spending limit for any
- 12 fiscal year shall be equal to the spending during the
- 13 <u>immediately prior fiscal year</u>, adjusted by the sum of:
- 14 (i) The percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for
- 15 All Urban Consumers from the immediately prior fiscal year, if
- 16 expressed as a positive number; and

- 1 (ii) The percentage change in population in this
- 2 Commonwealth during the immediately prior fiscal year, if
- 3 expressed as a positive number.
- 4 The percentage of the rate of change used in any fiscal year to
- 5 (I) THE AVERAGE PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN THE CONSUMER PRICE <--
- 6 INDEX FOR ALL URBAN CONSUMERS OVER THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING
- 7 THREE CALENDAR YEARS; AND
- 8 (II) THE AVERAGE PERCENTAGE INCREASE IN POPULATION IN THIS
- 9 COMMONWEALTH DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THREE CALENDAR
- 10 YEARS.
- 11 (B) THE PERCENTAGE OF THE RATE OF CHANGE CALCULATED UNDER
- 12 <u>SUBSECTION (A) USED IN ANY FISCAL YEAR TO adjust the SPENDING</u> <--

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- 13 <u>limit may be increased for that FISCAL year, but not to a</u>
- 14 percentage in excess of 120% of the sum established under this
- 15 subsection, by the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the
- 16 members elected to each House of the General Assembly. The
- 17 Commonwealth's spending limit as provided in this subsection <--
- 18 CALCULATED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) may be changed by the procedure <--
- 19 outlined in section 1(a) of Article XI.
- 20 (b) The spending limit may be exceeded for a declared <--
- 21 <u>emergency if the Governor so requests and the General Assembly</u>
- 22 approves by the affirmative vote of three fourths of the members
- 23 elected to each House of the General Assembly. The excess
- 24 spending authorized by exceeding the limit in this manner shall
- 25 <u>not be included in the computation base of the spending limit</u>
- 26 for any subsequent fiscal year.
- 27 <u>(c) The spending limit may be exceeded for the purpose of</u>
- 28 funding pension obligations if the Governor so requests and the
- 29 General Assembly approves by the affirmative vote of three-
- 30 fourths of the members elected to each House of the General

- 1 Assembly. The excess spending authorized by exceeding the limit
- 2 <u>in this manner shall not be included in the computation base of</u>
- 3 the spending limit for any subsequent fiscal year.
- 4 (C) Total spending by the Commonwealth means all <--
- 5 appropriations and authorizations from the General Fund, the <--
- 6 Public Transportation Assistance Fund and the Motor License Fund
- 7 and funds created after the effective date of this subsection,
- 8 and shall exclude refunds and the spending of Federal funds,
- 9 gifts or receipts restricted by laws in effect as of January 1, <--
- 10 2017 OF THE YEAR WHEN THIS SECTION IS RATIFIED AND APPROVED BY <--
- 11 THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH. This section shall
- 12 <u>not be circumvented by creating additional spending programs in <---</u>
- 13 <u>the General Fund or Motor License Fund or transferring spending</u>
- 14 from the General Fund or Motor License Fund to existing special <--
- 15 <u>funds or restricted receipt accounts.</u>
- 16 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 17 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the
- 18 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 19 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 20 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 21 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 22 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 23 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.
- 24 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this
- 25 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the
- 26 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 27 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 28 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 29 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 30 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of

- 1 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the
- 2 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment
- 3 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first
- 4 primary, general or municipal election which meets the
- 5 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article
- 6 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least
- 7 three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is
- 8 passed by the General Assembly.
- 9 Section 3. The addition of section 18(a) of Article VIII of
- 10 the Constitution of Pennsylvania shall become effective
- 11 beginning with the first fiscal year commencing more than six
- 12 months following approval of section 18 by the electorate.
