## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, further providing for alcohol, chemical and tobacco abuse program.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1547 of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is
12	amended to read:
13	Section 1547. Alcohol, <del>[</del> Chemical and <del>]</del> Tobacco <u>and Other Drug</u> <
14	Abuse Program(a) Beginning with school year 1991-1992 and
15	each year thereafter, each public school student shall receive
16	mandatory instruction in alcohol, <del>[</del> chemical and <del>]</del> tobacco <u>and</u> <
17	<del>other drug</del> abuse in every year in every grade from kindergarten
18	through grade twelve. The instruction shall be integrated within
19	the health course of study required in accordance with the State

Board of Education regulations. In grades where health is 1 2 offered, instruction may also be integrated into other 3 appropriate courses of study. In grades where health is not offered, instruction shall be integrated into an appropriate 4 curriculum requirement as listed in 22 Pa. Code [§ 5.4(b).] §§ <--5 4.21 (RELATING TO ELEMENTARY EDUCATION: PRIMARY AND INTERMEDIATE 6 LEVELS), 4.22 (RELATING TO MIDDLE LEVEL EDUCATION) AND 4.23 7 8 (RELATING TO HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION). 9 This instruction: (1)10 (i) Shall be age appropriate. 11 Shall be sequential in method of study. (ii) 12 Shall discourage the use of alcohol, tobacco and (iii) controlled substances. 13 14 +(iv) Shall communicate that the use of illicit drugs and <---15 the improper use of legally obtained drugs is wrong. <---16 (v) Shall create a program with the goal of reducing or eliminating the incidence and prevalence of student alcohol, 17 18 tobacco and other drug abuse. 19 (vi) Shall communicate opioid abuse prevention, with an emphasis on the prescription drug epidemic and the connection 20 between prescription opioid abuse and addiction to other drugs, 21 22 including heroin. 23 (vii) Shall increase the knowledge and skills of stude 24 for avoiding the harmful effects of alcohol, tobacco and other 25 drug use. 26 {School districts} Each school district may provide a (2)27 comprehensive program of prevention and may utilize any 28 appropriate public or private materials, personnel and other 29 resources in developing and implementing this program of instruction[.] and prevention. 1 <del>interactive</del> materials to maximize group interactions 2 prevention programs with the involvement of community components 3 including, but not limited to, the use of self-help groups. The Department of {Health, Office of Drug and Alcohol Programs, 4 <---5 shall make available information about appropriate curriculum materials and the creation of a comprehensive program of 6 <---7 prevention upon request of a school district. In developing its 8 alcohol, fchemical and tobacco and other drug abuse <---9 instructional program, each school district shall consult with 10 the single county authority designated by the Department of -{Health-} Drug and Alcohol Programs to provide drug and alcohol 11 <---12 services in the school district's area. 13 (A.1) BEGINNING WITH THE 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR, FOR STUDENTS <--14 IN GRADES SIX THROUGH TWELVE, THE INSTRUCTION REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) SHALL INCLUDE INSTRUCTION RELATED TO THE 15 16 PREVENTION OF OPIOID ABUSE, WITH AN EMPHASIS ON THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG EPIDEMIC AND THE CONNECTION BETWEEN PRESCRIPTION OPIOID 17 18 ABUSE AND ADDICTION TO OTHER DRUGS, INCLUDING HEROIN. THE 19 INSTRUCTION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL ENCOURAGE THE USE OF SELF-HELP GROUPS. NOT LATER THAN THE BEGINNING OF THE 2018-2019 20 SCHOOL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF 21 22 HEALTH SHALL DEVELOP JOINTLY A MODEL CURRICULUM FOR THIS PURPOSE 23 AND EACH DEPARTMENT SHALL POST THE MODEL CURRICULUM ON ITS 24 PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE. THE MODEL CURRICULUM 25 DEVELOPED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE REVISED WHEN NECESSARY 26 TO ENSURE THAT THE MODEL CURRICULUM PROVIDES THE MOST CURRENT INFORMATION. IN PROVIDING THE INSTRUCTION REQUIRED UNDER THIS 27 28 SUBSECTION, A SCHOOL DISTRICT MAY, BUT SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO, 29 USE THE MODEL CURRICULUM. 30 (b) Each school district is hereby authorized to develop and

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offer programs relating to alcohol, {chemical and} tobacco and <--1 2 other drug abuse for parents of students enrolled in the public 3 schools. If a school district does develop such programs, they shall be developed in consultation with the single county 4 authority designated by the Department of {Health} Drug and 5 <---Alcohol Programs to provide drug and alcohol services in the 6 school district's area. Such programs shall be offered at no 7 8 cost to parents.

9 (c) The Secretary of Education, in consultation with the 10 Secretary of {Health} <u>Drug and Alcohol Programs</u>, shall develop <--11 curriculum guidelines for instruction on alcohol, {chemical and} <--12 tobacco <u>and other drug</u> abuse and the laws governing their use <--13 and misuse. These guidelines shall encourage the inclusion of 14 the following elements where appropriate in the instruction:

(1) Detailed factual information regarding the hysiological, psychological, sociological and legal aspects of substance abuse.

19 and assistance for students and their families with alcohol,

21 <u>including prescription opioid abuse</u>.

(3) The goals of quality education as set forth in 22 Pa.
Code [\$ 5.13(f)] (RELATING TO EDUCATION).

(4) Skills needed to evaluate advertisements for and media
portrayals of alcohol, <del>[</del>chemical and<del>]</del> tobacco <del>and other drug</del> <--</li>
products.

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(5) Detailed instruction on the need for and the role of lawful authority and law-abiding behavior, including interaction with members of the legal and justice community.

30 (d) <u>(1)</u> Beginning with the 1991-1992 school year and each <--20170HB0121PN2058 - 4 -

year thereafter, the Secretary of Education, in consultation 1 2 with the Secretary of {Health} Drug and Alcohol Programs, shall <--3 make available, to all school districts and intermediate units, in-service training programs based upon the instruction 4 requirements established in subsection (a) and the curriculum 5 6 guidelines established in subsection (c). The programs shall 7 provide preparation for the teaching of mandated instruction in 8 alcohol, {chemical and} tobacco and other drug abuse. The in-<---9 service programs may utilize the single county authorities 10 designated by the Department of {Health} Drug and Alcohol\_ <---11 Programs or such other institutions, agencies or persons as the 12 Secretary of Education deems appropriate.

13 (2) BEGINNING WITH THE 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT <--14 OF EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SHALL DEVELOP JOINTLY 15 AND SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE TO ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS IN-SERVICE TRAINING PROGRAMS BASED UPON THE INSTRUCTION 16 17 REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (A.1) AND THE MODEL 18 CURRICULUM DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (A.1). THE IN-SERVICE 19 TRAINING PROGRAMS DEVELOPED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE 20 REVISED WHEN NECESSARY TO ENSURE THAT THE IN-SERVICE TRAINING 21 PROGRAMS PROVIDE THE MOST CURRENT INFORMATION.

(1) Beginning with the 1991-1992 school year, each 22 (e) <--23 school district shall provide, as part of its in-service 24 training, programs on alcohol, drugs, tobacco and dangerous controlled substances for all instructors whose teaching 25 26 responsibilities include courses of study in which mandated 27 instruction concerning alcohol, {chemical and} tobacco and other <--28 drug abuse is integrated. To comply with this requirement, a 29 school district may utilize the programs made available by the 30 Department of Education or use other alternative programs.

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1 (2) BEGINNING WITH THE 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR AND EVERY THREE <--(3) YEARS THEREAFTER, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL PROVIDE, AS 2 3 PART OF ITS IN-SERVICE TRAINING, PROGRAMS BASED UPON THE INSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (A.1) FOR 4 ALL INSTRUCTORS WHOSE TEACHING RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE COURSES 5 OF STUDY IN WHICH SUCH MANDATED INSTRUCTION IS INTEGRATED. TO 6 COMPLY WITH THIS REQUIREMENT, A SCHOOL DISTRICT MAY UTILIZE THE 7 8 IN-SERVICE TRAINING PROGRAMS MADE AVAILABLE UNDER SUBSECTION (D) 9 (2).

10 (f) The governing board of each intermediate unit in which a nonpublic school is located shall have the authority and the 11 12 duty to loan to all students attending nonpublic schools within the intermediate unit all educational materials developed by 13 14 either the Department of Education or the Department of {Health}-<--15 Drug and Alcohol Programs, pursuant to this act for the 16 instruction of public school students on the nature and effects of drugs, alcohol, tobacco and dangerous controlled substances. 17 18 Local school boards need not expend funds which are not provided 19 by either the Federal or State Government for drug education 20 programs for the use or loan of these materials. A nonpublic 21 school may utilize the in-service training programs made 22 available by the Department of Education through the 23 intermediate unit.

(g) On or before June 1, 1991, the Secretary of Education shall recommend to the General Assembly a plan to require and assist each school district to establish and maintain a program to provide appropriate counseling and support services to students who experience problems related to the use of drugs, alcohol and dangerous controlled substances.

10	(h.1) By <del>June 1, 2019, and by June 1</del> SEPTEMBER 1, 2020, AND <
11	BY SEPTEMBER 1 OF every fifth year thereafter, the Department of
12	Education, in consultation with the Department of Drug and <
13	Alcohol Programs HEALTH, shall report to the General Assembly <
14	concerning the preceding school year activities of the
15	Department of Education and the Department of Drug and Alcohol <
16	Programs HEALTH pertaining to the provisions of this section. <
17	The report shall include:
18	(1) A <del>plan</del> DESCRIPTION OF EFFORTS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF <
19	EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH to assist school
20	districts in establishing a comprehensive program of prevention, <
21	including the coordination of self-help groups. PROVIDING THE <
22	INSTRUCTION REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (A.1), INCLUDING
23	EFFORTS TO DEVELOP AND POST THE MODEL CURRICULUM REQUIRED UNDER
24	SUBSECTION (A.1) AND TO DEVELOP AND MAKE AVAILABLE THE IN-
25	SERVICE TRAINING PROGRAMS REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (D)(2).
26	(2) An evaluation of the effectiveness of the program <
27	INSTRUCTION REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (A.1) AND OF <
28	CURRICULUM MATERIALS AND IN-SERVICE TRAINING PROGRAMS DEVELOPED
29	BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
30	UNDER THIS SECTION in reducing the use of alcohol, tobacco and
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1 other drugs, including prescription opioids, by students.

regulations necessary for the implementation of this section.
Section 2. The amendment of section 1547(a), (d) and (e)
ADDITION OF SECTION 1547(G.1) of the act shall apply to the
2018-2019 school year and each school year thereafter.
Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
