AN ACT

1 Amending the act of November 4, 2016 (P.L.1196, No.159),
 2 entitled "An act designating a portion of State Route 663 in
 3 Montgomery County as the Army Specialist Ray Ira Haas
 4 Memorial Highway; designating the portion of State Route 100
 5 from Hereford Township at the Lehigh County line through
 6 Washington Township in Berks County as the First Lieutenant
 7 William R. Gendebien Memorial Highway; designating a portion
 8 of State Route 2026, also known as Blair Mill Road, in
 9 Montgomery County as the Private First Class Paul T. Wright
 10 Memorial Highway; designating a bridge on a portion of Sheep
 11 Bridge Road over I-83, Newberry Township, York County, as the
 12 Staff Sgt. Jason M. Faley Memorial Bridge; designating a
 13 bridge on that portion of State Route 879 over Trout Run in
 14 Goshen Township, Clearfield County, as the Private David Kyle
 15 McCracken Memorial Bridge; designating a portion of State
 16 Route 2034 in Montgomery County as the Cpl. Carl F. Hynek III
 17 Memorial Highway; designating a portion of State Route 145 in

 19 Smith Memorial Highway; designating a bridge on that portion
 20 of U.S. Route 15 over State Route 114, Upper Allen Township,

 22 Memorial Bridge; designating a portion of Byberry Road
 23 between Warminster Road and Orangemen's Road in Montgomery
 24 County as the Major Jeffrey Toczylowski Memorial Highway;
 25 designating a portion of State Route 1010 in Berks County as
 26 the DeLight Breidegam, Jr., Memorial Highway; designating a
 27 portion of State Route 51 in Fayette County as the Officer
 28 Richard Champion Memorial Highway; designating a bridge on
 29 that portion of State Route 741 over the Conestoga River,
 30 between Pequea Township and Lancaster Township, Lancaster
 31 County, as the Cpl. Eric M. Torbert, Jr., Memorial Bridge;
 32 designating the interchange of State Route 43, the Mon-
 33 Fayette Expressway, with Rubles Mill Road, known as Exit 4,
 34 Fayette County, as the Master Sgt. Arthur L. Lilley Memorial
 35 Interchange; designating a bridge on that portion of State

1 Route 770 over the Tunungwant Creek, Bradford Township,
2 McKean County, as the Master Sgt. Thomas Maholic Memorial
3 Bridge; designating a bridge to be constructed on that
4 portion of State Route 6 over Dingman Run, Coudersport
5 Borough, Potter County, as the PFC George Pesock Memorial
6 Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of State Route
7 872 over Bailey Run in Wharton Township, Potter County, as
8 the Sgt. Paul M. Brown Memorial Bridge; designating a certain
9 interchange in New Stanton Borough, Westmoreland County, as
10 the E. Jeffrey Wentzel Memorial Interchange; designating a
11 portion of State Route 220 in Lycoming and Sullivan Counties
12 as the Lieutenant Commander John J. Peterman Memorial
13 Highway; designating a portion of State Route 220 in Lycoming
14 County as the Thomas A. Paternostro Memorial Highway;
15 designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 1027 in
16 Polk Township, Jefferson County, as the Polk Township
17 Veterans Memorial Bridge; and making related repeals,"
18 amending the title of the act; and further providing for Cpl.
19 Carl F. Hynek III Memorial Highway.

20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
21 hereby enacts as follows:

22 Section 1. The title and section 6 of the act of November 4,
23 2016 (P.L.1196, No.159), entitled "An act designating a portion
24 of State Route 663 in Montgomery County as the Army Specialist
25 Ray Ira Haas Memorial Highway; designating the portion of State
26 Route 100 from Hereford Township at the Lehigh County line
27 through Washington Township in Berks County as the First
28 Lieutenant William R. Gendebien Memorial Highway; designating a
29 portion of State Route 2026, also known as Blair Mill Road, in
30 Montgomery County as the Private First Class Paul T. Wright
31 Memorial Highway; designating a bridge on a portion of Sheep
32 Bridge Road over I-83, Newberry Township, York County, as the
33 Staff Sgt. Jason M. Faley Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge
34 on that portion of State Route 879 over Trout Run in Goshen
35 Township, Clearfield County, as the Private David Kyle McCracken
36 Memorial Bridge; designating a portion of State Route 2034 in
37 Montgomery County as the Cpl. Carl F. Hynek III Memorial
38 Highway; designating a portion of State Route 145 in Salisbury

10 designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 741 over the
11 Conestoga River, between Pequea Township and Lancaster Township,
12 Lancaster County, as the Cpl. Eric M. Torbert, Jr., Memorial
13 Bridge; designating the interchange of State Route 43, the Mon-
14 Fayette Expressway, with Rubles Mill Road, known as Exit 4,
15 Fayette County, as the Master Sgt. Arthur L. Lilley Memorial
16 Interchange; designating a bridge on that portion of State Route
17 770 over the Tunungwant Creek, Bradford Township, McKean County,
18 as the Master Sgt. Thomas Maholic Memorial Bridge; designating a
19 bridge to be constructed on that portion of State Route 6 over
20 Dingman Run, Coudersport Borough, Potter County, as the PFC
21 George Pesock Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that
22 portion of State Route 872 over Bailey Run in Wharton Township,
23 Potter County, as the Sgt. Paul M. Brown Memorial Bridge;
24 designating a certain interchange in New Stanton Borough,
25 Westmoreland County, as the E. Jeffrey Wentzel Memorial
26 Interchange; designating a portion of State Route 220 in

29 Route 220 in Lycoming County as the Thomas A. Paternostro
30 Memorial Highway; designating a bridge on that portion of State

9 State Route 770 over the Tunungwant Creek, Bradford Township,
10 McKean County, as the Master Sgt. Thomas Maholic Memorial
11 Bridge; designating a bridge to be constructed on that
12 portion of State Route 6 over Dingman Run, Coudersport
13 Borough, Potter County, as the PFC George Pesock Memorial
14 Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of State Route
15 872 over Bailey Run in Wharton Township, Potter County, as
16 the Sgt. Paul M. Brown Memorial Bridge; designating a certain
17 interchange in New Stanton Borough, Westmoreland County, as
18 the E. Jeffrey Wentzel Memorial Interchange; designating a
19 portion of State Route 220 in Lycoming and Sullivan Counties
20 as the Lieutenant Commander John J. Peterman Memorial
21 Highway; designating a portion of State Route 220 in Lycoming
22 County as the Thomas A. Paternostro Memorial Highway;
23 designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 1027 in
24 Polk Township, Jefferson County, as the Polk Township
25 Veterans Memorial Bridge; and making related repeals.

26 Section 6. Cpl. Carl F. Hynek III Memorial Highway.

27 (a) Findings.--

28 (1) Cpl. Carl Hynek was born and raised in Upper
29 Moreland Township, Montgomery County.

30 (2) Cpl. Carl Hynek was drafted into the United States

1 Army after his high school graduation and served in Vietnam
2 with the 101st Airborne Division.

3 (3) Cpl. Carl Hynek was killed on October 5, 1967, in
4 Quang Nam, South Vietnam, at 22 years of age from wounds he
5 received in an intense firefight with enemy forces.

6 (b) Designation.--The section of State Route [2034] 2044 in
7 Montgomery County from Terwood Road to Moreland Road is hereby
8 designated the Cpl. Carl F. Hynek III Memorial Highway.

9 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
10 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
11 traffic in both directions on the highway.

12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
