AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in rules of the road in general, providing for 3 solid waste collection vehicles; in miscellaneous provisions, 4 further providing for the offense of homicide by vehicle and 5 for the offense of aggravated assault by vehicle; and, in 6 lighting equipment, further providing for use and display of 7 illuminated signs. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania 12 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read: 13 § 102. Definitions. 14 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent 15 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when 16 17 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly 18 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section: 19 * * * 20 "Solid waste collection vehicle." A vehicle used for the

curbside collection of municipal solid waste.

- 2 Section 2. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 3 § 3329. Solid waste collection vehicles.
- 4 (a) General rule. -- Upon approaching and passing a stationary
- 5 solid waste collection vehicle that is giving a visual signal by
- 6 means of flashing, rotating or oscillating lights as required
- 7 under section 4307(d.1) (relating to use and display of
- 8 <u>illuminated signs</u>), the driver of an approaching vehicle shall
- 9 reduce to and maintain a safe speed for weather, road conditions
- 10 and vehicular or pedestrian traffic and proceed with due care
- 11 <u>and caution.</u>
- 12 (b) Penalty.--A person who violates subsection (a) commits a
- 13 <u>summary offense and shall, upon conviction, pay a fine of not</u>
- 14 <u>more than \$250.</u>
- 15 (c) Fines to be doubled. -- In addition to any penalty
- 16 provided in subsection (b), the fine shall be double for any of
- 17 the following violations committed in an area where sanitation
- 18 workers are at risk from traffic and the operator knows or
- 19 should know that sanitation workers are present:

23	(d) Reports by solid waste collection workers
24	(1) A solid waste collection worker observing a
25	violation of subsection (a) may prepare a written, signed
26	report which indicates that a violation has occurred. To the
27	extent possible, the report shall include the following:
28	(i) Information pertaining to the identity of the
29	alleged violator.
30	(ii) The license number and color of the vehicle

1	involved in the violation.
2	(iii) The time and approximate location when the
3	violation occurred.
4	(iv) Identification of the vehicle as an automobile,
5	station wagon, motor truck, motor bus, motorcycle or
6	other type of vehicle.
7	(2) Within 48 hours after the violation occurs, the
8	solid waste collection worker shall deliver a copy of the
9	report to a police officer having authority to exercise
10	police power in the area where the violation occurred subject
11	to the following:
12	(i) If the police officer believes that the report
13	establishes a sufficient basis for the issuance of a
14	citation, the officer shall file a citation and a copy of
15	the report with the issuing authority.
16	(ii) If the issuing authority determines that the
17	report and citation establish a sufficient basis for the
18	issuance of a summons, a summons shall be issued in
19	accordance with general rules governing the institution
20	of proceedings in summary traffic offense cases.
21	(iii) The issuing authority shall send the defendant
22	a copy of the citation, together with a statement that it
23	was filed by the police officer named in the citation on
24	the basis of information received.
25	(3) A person may institute a proceeding pursuant to this
26	subsection or in accordance with any means authorized by the
27	Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.
28	Section 3. Sections 3732(b) and 3732.1(b) of Title 75,
29	amended November 4, 2016 (P.L.1277, No.165), are amended to
30	read:

- 3 (b) Sentencing.--
- 4 (1) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a
 5 person convicted of a violation of subsection (a) may be
 6 sentenced to an additional term not to exceed five years'
 7 confinement if at trial the prosecution proves beyond a
 8 reasonable doubt that the offense occurred in an active work
 9 zone.
- 10 (1.1) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a person convicted of a violation of subsection (a) as the 11 12 result of a violation of section 3316 (relating to 13 prohibiting text-based communications), 3325 (relating to 14 duty of driver on approach of emergency vehicle) [or], 3327 15 (relating to duty of driver in emergency response areas) or 16 3329(a) (relating to solid waste collection vehicles) and who 17 is convicted of violating section 3316, 3325 [or], 3327 or 18 3329(a) may be sentenced to an additional term not to exceed 19 five years' confinement when the violation resulted in death.
 - (2) The prosecution must indicate intent to proceed under this section in the indictment or information which commences the prosecution.
- 23 (3) The Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing, pursuant 24 to 42 Pa.C.S. § 2154 (relating to adoption of guidelines for 25 sentencing), shall provide for a sentencing enhancement for 26 an offense under this section when the violation occurred in 27 an active work zone or was the result of a violation of 28 section 3316, 3325 [or], 3327 or 3329(a).

- 1 (b) Sentencing.--
- 2 (1) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a
 3 person convicted of a violation of subsection (a) may be
 4 sentenced to an additional term not to exceed two years'
 5 confinement if at trial the prosecution proves beyond a
 6 reasonable doubt that the offense occurred in an active work
 7 zone.
- 8 In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a 9 person convicted of a violation of subsection (a) as the 10 result of a violation of section 3316 (relating to prohibiting text-based communications), 3325 (relating to 11 12 duty of driver on approach of emergency vehicle) [or], 3327 13 (relating to duty of driver in emergency response areas) or 14 3329(a) (relating to solid waste collection vehicles) and who 15 is convicted of violating section 3316, 3325 [or], 3327 or 3329(a) may be sentenced to an additional term not to exceed 16 17 two years' confinement when the violation resulted in serious 18 bodily injury.
 - (3) The prosecution must indicate intent to proceed under this section in the indictment or information which commences the prosecution.

 24 sentencing), shall provide for a sentencing enhancement for
 25 an offense under this section when the violation occurred in

- 2 (d.1) Solid waste collection vehicle. -- A solid waste
- 3 <u>collection vehicle shall be equipped with flashing, rotating or</u>
- 4 <u>oscillating lights that can be seen by traffic moving in both</u>
- 5 <u>directions.</u>

- 7 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
