11	Section 1. Section 3 of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345,

18	suspension," is amended by adding a subsection to read:
19	Section 3. Hearing examiners.
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1	(e) Reporting of offensesEach holder of a license,
2	registration, certificate or permit from a licensing board or
3	commission shall report to the issuing licensing board or
4	commission, in writing, within 30 days, if the individual has
5	been convicted, found guilty or pleaded nolo contendere,
6	received probation without verdict or received accelerated
7	rehabilitative disposition as to any felony or misdemeanor or
8	any drug violation. A criminal matter that has been expunged by
9	order of a court is not required to be reported.

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
