AN ACT

1 Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for use of government
3 property.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

17 § 2101. Definitions.

18 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

1 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
2 context clearly indicates otherwise:

3 "Political subdivision." A county, city, borough,
4 incorporated town, township, school district, vocational school
5 or county institution district, and an authority, entity or body
6 organized by a county, city, borough, incorporated town,
7 township, school district, vocational school or county
8 institution district.

9 "Public employee." An individual employed by the
10 Commonwealth or a political subdivision.

11 "Public official." A person elected by the public or elected
12 or appointed by a governmental body or an appointed official in
13 the executive, legislative or judicial branch of this
14 Commonwealth or a political subdivision thereof.

15 § 2102. Proof of valid driver's license required.

16 A public official or public employee who operates a
17 government vehicle shall annually provide proof to the
18 respective governmental body or employer responsible for the
19 vehicle that the public official or public employee holds a
20 valid driver's license under the provisions of 75 Pa.C.S. Ch. 15
21 (relating to licensing of drivers).

22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
