15	"Progressive system." A computerized system linking slot
16	machines in one or more licensed facilities within this
17	Commonwealth, or within this Commonwealth and another state, as
18	authorized under this title, and offering one or more common
19	progressive payouts based on the amounts wagered.

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Section 2. Section 1207(6) of Title 4 is amended to read:
\$ 1207. Regulatory authority of board.

4 The board shall have the power and its duties shall be to: 5 * * *

Prescribe criteria and conditions for the operation 6 (6) 7 of slot machine progressive systems. A wide area progressive 8 slot system shall be collectively administered by 9 participating slot machine licensees in accordance with the terms of a written agreement executed by each participating 10 11 slot machine licensee and approved by the board. The board 12 may enter into an interstate compact or reciprocal agreement 13 with another state for the conduct and administration of a 14 multistate progressive system. The board shall promulgate 15 regulations prescribing criteria and conditions for 16 interstate compacts and reciprocal agreements. * * * 17 18 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
