## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in sports and amusements, providing
- for underage persons in licensed facilities and for underage
- 4 gambling; and making an inconsistent repeal.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding sections to read:
- 9 § 7108. Underage persons in licensed facilities.
- 10 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits a summary offense if
- 11 the person, being under 21 years of age, enters and remains in
- 12 <u>an area of a licensed facility where slot machines are operated</u>
- 13 or the play of table games in conducted.
- 14 (b) Exception. -- A person 18 to 21 years of age who is
- 15 employed by a slot machine licensee, a gaming service provider,
- 16 the board or any other regulatory or emergency response agency
- 17 may enter and remain in an area of a licensed facility while
- 18 acting within the scope of the person's employment or volunteer
- 19 duties.

- 1 (c) Diversionary program. -- The magisterial district judge or
- 2 any judicial authority with jurisdiction over the violation
- 3 <u>shall give first consideration to referring a person charged</u>
- 4 with a violation of subsection (a) to a diversionary program
- 5 under 42 Pa.C.S. § 1520 (relating to adjudication alternative
- 6 program) and the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure. As
- 7 part of the diversionary program, the magisterial district judge
- 8 or any judicial authority with jurisdiction over the violation
- 9 may order the person to participate in a counseling or treatment
- 10 program for problem gambling. The program shall be administered
- 11 by the single county authority created under the act of April
- 12 14, 1972 (P.L.221, No.63), known as the Pennsylvania Drug and
- 13 Alcohol Abuse Control Act, or its designee. Upon completion of
- 14 the program, the single county authority shall report to the
- 15 magisterial district judge or the judicial authority with
- 16 jurisdiction over the violation. If the person successfully
- 17 completes the diversionary program, the court shall order that
- 18 the person's records of the charge of violating this section be
- 19 expunged as provided for under section 9122 (relating to
- 20 expungement).
- 21 (d) Penalties. -- A person convicted of an offense under
- 22 <u>subsection</u> (a) shall be sentenced as follows:
- 23 (1) For a first offense, to pay a fine of not more than
- 24 \$250.
- 25 (2) For a second offense, to pay a fine of not more than
- 26 \$500 and perform not less than 20 hours of community service.
- 27 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, to pay a fine of
- 28 not more than \$1,000 and perform not less than 50 hours of
- 29 <u>community service.</u>
- 30 (e) Duties of board.--

- 1 (1) The board shall place the name of a person convicted
- 2 <u>of an offense under subsection (a) on the exclusion list</u>
- 3 <u>established by the board under 4 Pa.C.S. § 1514 (relating to</u>
- 4 <u>regulation requiring exclusion or ejection of certain</u>
- 5 persons) for the following time periods:
- 6 <u>(i) For a first offense, a minimum of six months</u>
- 7 commencing on the date the individual reaches 21 years of
- 8 <u>age.</u>
- 9 <u>(ii) For a second offense, a minimum of one year</u>
- 10 <u>commencing on the date the individual reaches 21 years of</u>
- 11 <u>age.</u>
- 12 (iii) For a third or subsequent offense, a minimum
- of two years commencing on the date the individual
- reaches 21 years of age.
- 15 (2) A person placed on the exclusion list under this
- 16 <u>section may not petition the board for removal from the list</u>
- 17 until the expiration of the exclusion period.
- 18 (f) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 19 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 20 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 21 "Board." The Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board established
- 22 under 4 Pa.C.S. § 1201 (relating to Pennsylvania Gaming Control

- "Licensed facility." As defined in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1103

- 26 "Slot machine." As defined in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1103.
- 27 <u>"Table game."</u> As defined in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1103.
- 28 § 7109. Underage gambling.
- 29 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits a summary offense if
- 30 the person, being under 21 years of age, wagers, plays or

- 1 <u>attempts to wager or play a slot machine or table game at a</u>
- 2 licensed facility.
- 3 (b) Diversionary program. -- The magisterial district judge or
- 4 any judicial authority with jurisdiction over the violation
- 5 <u>shall give first consideration to referring a person charged</u>
- 6 with a violation of subsection (a) to a diversionary program
- 7 under 42 Pa.C.S. § 1520 (relating to adjudication alternative
- 8 program) and the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure. As
- 9 part of the diversionary program, the magisterial district judge
- 10 or any judicial authority with jurisdiction over the violation
- 11 may order the person to participate in a counseling or treatment

- 30 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, to pay a fine of

- 1 <u>not more than \$2,000 and perform not less than 100 hours of</u>
- 2 <u>community service.</u>
- 3 (d) Duties of board.--
- 4 (1) The board shall place the name of an individual
- 5 <u>convicted of an offense under subsection (a) on the exclusion</u>
- 6 <u>list established by the board under 4 Pa.C.S. § 1514</u>
- 7 <u>(relating to regulation requiring exclusion or ejection of</u>
- 8 <u>certain persons</u>) for the following time periods:
- (i) For a first offense, a minimum of one year
- 10 <u>commencing on the date the individual reaches 21 years of</u>
- 11 <u>age.</u>
- 12 <u>(ii) For a second offense, a minimum of two years</u>
- 13 <u>commencing on the date the individual reaches 21 years of</u>
- 14 <u>age.</u>
- 15 <u>(iii) For a third or subsequent offense, a minimum</u>
- of five years commencing on the date the individual
- 17 reaches 21 years of age.
- 18 (2) A person placed on the exclusion list under this
- 19 section may not petition the board for removal from the list
- 20 until the expiration of the exclusion period.
- 21 (e) Forfeiture. -- Any winnings received by a person from a
- 22 wager or play at a licensed facility shall be subject to
- 23 forfeiture to the General Fund and the person shall not have a
- 24 property right in the winnings.
- 25 (f) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 26 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 27 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 28 "Board." The Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board established
- 29 under 4 Pa.C.S. § 1201 (relating to Pennsylvania Gaming Control
- 30 Board established).

- 1 "Licensed facility." As defined in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1103
- 2 <u>(relating to definitions).</u>
- 3 "Slot machine." As defined in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1103.
- 4 <u>"Table game." As defined in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1103.</u>
- 5 Section 2. The provisions of 4 Pa.C.S. § 1518(b)(3) are
- 6 repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with this act.
- 7 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
