AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 19, 1988 (P.L.1262, No.156), 1 entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the licensing of 2 eligible organizations to conduct games of chance, for the 3 licensing of persons to distribute games of chance, for the 5 registration of manufacturers of games of chance, and for suspensions and revocations of licenses and permits; 6 requiring records; providing for local referendum by electorate; and prescribing penalties," in preliminary 7 8 provisions, further providing for legislative intent and for 9 10 definitions; in games of chance, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR PRIZE <--LIMITS, providing for airport 50/50 drawing and further 11 providing for licensing of eligible organizations; in club 12 licensees, further providing for club licensee and for 13 distribution of proceeds; and, in enforcement, further 14 15 providing for enforcement. 16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 17 hereby enacts as follows: 18 Section 1. Section 102 of the act of December 19, 1988 19 (P.L.1262, No.156), known as the Local Option Small Games of
- 20 Chance Act, is amended to read:
- 21 Section 102. Legislative intent.
- The General Assembly hereby declares that the playing of
- 23 games of chance for the purpose of raising funds, by certain
- 24 nonprofit associations, for the promotion of charitable or civic

- 1 purposes, is in the public interest. In some cases, the proceeds
- 2 from games of chance may be utilized to support certain
- 3 operating expenses of certain organizations.
- 4 The General Assembly hereby declares that raising public
- 5 funds from games of chance in licensed restaurants and
- 6 protecting the competitiveness of these restaurants is also in
- 7 the public interest.
- 8 The General Assembly hereby declares that raising funds from
- 9 a 50/50 drawing conducted in airport systems, the net proceeds
- 10 of which will be used for charitable purposes, is in the public
- 11 interest.
- 12 It is hereby declared to be the policy of the General
- 13 Assembly that all phases of licensing, operation and regulation
- 14 of games of chance be strictly controlled, and that all laws and
- 15 regulations with respect thereto as well as all gambling laws
- 16 should be strictly construed and rigidly enforced.
- 17 The General Assembly recognizes the possibility of
- 18 association between commercial gambling and organized crime, and
- 19 wishes to prevent participation by organized crime and prevent
- 20 the diversion of funds from the purposes herein authorized.
- 21 Section 2. Section 103 of the act is amended by adding
- 22 definitions to read:
- 23 Section 103. Definitions.
- 24 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall,
- 25 except as provided under section 902, have the meanings given to
- 26 them in this section unless the context clearly indicates
- 27 otherwise:

- 29 "Airport." A publicly owned commercial service airport that
- 30 is designated by the Federal Government as an international

- 1 <u>airport.</u>
- 2 "Airport 50/50 drawing." A 50/50 drawing that is conducted
- 3 by an airport in accordance with section 304.2.
- 4 * * *
- 5 SECTION 3. SECTION 302 OF THE ACT IS AMENDED TO READ:

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- 6 SECTION 302. PRIZE LIMITS.
- 7 (A) INDIVIDUAL PRIZE LIMIT.--
- 8 (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTIONS (D) AND (D.1),
- 9 THE MAXIMUM PRIZE WHICH MAY BE AWARDED FOR ANY SINGLE CHANCE
- 10 SHALL BE \$2,000[.], OTHER THAN A WEEKLY DRAWING.
- 11 (2) THE MAXIMUM PRIZE WHICH MAY BE AWARDED FOR ANY
- 12 WEEKLY DRAWING SHALL BE \$14,000.
- 13 [(B) AGGREGATE PRIZE LIMIT. -- NO MORE THAN \$35,000 IN PRIZES
- 14 SHALL BE AWARDED FROM GAMES OF CHANCE BY A LICENSED ELIGIBLE
- 15 ORGANIZATION IN ANY SEVEN-DAY PERIOD.]
- 16 (C) RAFFLE PRIZE LIMIT.--UP TO \$15,000 IN PRIZES MAY BE
- 17 AWARDED IN RAFFLES IN ANY CALENDAR MONTH.
- 18 [(C.1) TOTAL LIMIT.--ALL PRIZES AWARDED UNDER THIS SECTION
- 19 SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE AGGREGATE PRIZE LIMITS UNDER SUBSECTION
- 20 (B).]
- 21 (D) EXCEPTION FOR RAFFLES. -- NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION [(B)
- 22 OR] (C), A LICENSED ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATION MAY CONDUCT A RAFFLE
- 23 UNDER SECTION 308 AND AWARD A PRIZE OR PRIZES VALUED IN EXCESS
- 24 OF \$3,000 EACH ONLY UNDER THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:
- 25 (1) THE LICENSING AUTHORITY HAS ISSUED A SPECIAL PERMIT
- 26 FOR THE RAFFLE UNDER SECTION 308.
- 27 (2) A LICENSED ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATION SHALL BE ELIGIBLE
- 28 TO RECEIVE NO MORE THAN TEN SPECIAL PERMITS IN ANY LICENSED
- 29 TERM EXCEPT THAT A VOLUNTEER FIRE, AMBULANCE, RESCUE OR
- 30 CONSERVATION ORGANIZATION THAT IS NOT A CLUB LICENSEE SHALL

- 1 BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE 12 SPECIAL PERMITS IN ANY LICENSED
- 2 TERM.
- 3 (3) ONLY ONE RAFFLE MAY BE CONDUCTED UNDER EACH SPECIAL
- 4 PERMIT ISSUED UNDER SECTION 308.
- 5 (4) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (D.1), THE TOTAL
- 6 OF ALL PRIZES AWARDED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE NO MORE
- 7 THAN \$150,000 PER CALENDAR YEAR, WHICH SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT
- 8 TO THE AGGREGATE LIMIT UNDER SUBSECTION [(B) OR] (C).
- 9 (D.1) ADDITIONAL AWARD.--A VOLUNTEER FIRE, AMBULANCE, RESCUE
- 10 OR CONSERVATION ORGANIZATION MAY, IN ADDITION TO THE TOTAL UNDER
- 11 SUBSECTION (D)(4), AWARD UP TO \$100,000 FROM RAFFLES WHICH SHALL
- 12 NOT BE SUBJECT TO THE AGGREGATE LIMIT UNDER SUBSECTION [(B),]
- 13 (C) OR (D).
- 14 (F) DAILY DRAWING CARRYOVER. -- THE PRIZE LIMITATION CONTAINED
- 15 IN [SUBSECTIONS] SUBSECTION (A) [AND (B)] MAY BE EXCEEDED BY A
- 16 DAILY DRAWING UNDER THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES: A DAILY DRAWING
- 17 MAY AWARD A PRIZE IN EXCESS OF \$2,000 IF SUCH PRIZE IS THE
- 18 RESULT OF A CARRYOVER OF A DRAWING WHICH RESULTED FROM THE
- 19 WINNING NUMBER IN SUCH DRAWING NOT BEING AMONG THE ELIGIBLE
- 20 ENTRANTS IN SUCH DRAWINGS. NOTHING CONTAINED HEREIN SHALL
- 21 AUTHORIZE THE PRIZE LIMITATION AS CONTAINED IN [SUBSECTIONS]
- 22 SUBSECTION (A) [AND (B)] TO BE EXCEEDED AS A RESULT OF A FAILURE
- 23 TO CONDUCT A DRAWING ON AN OPERATING DAY DURING WHICH CHANCES
- 24 WERE SOLD FOR A DAILY DRAWING OR FOR A DAILY DRAWING FOR WHICH
- 25 CHANCES WERE SOLD IN EXCESS OF \$1 OR FOR WHICH MORE THAN ONE
- 26 CHANCE WAS SOLD TO AN ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANT.
- 27 [(G) ADDITIONAL EXCEPTION. -- WHEN A DAILY DRAWING OR WEEKLY
- 28 DRAWING IS SET UP OR CONDUCTED IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PAY OUT OR
- 29 AWARD 100% OF THE GROSS REVENUES GENERATED FROM SUCH DRAWING,
- 30 THE LIMITATION CONTAINED IN SUBSECTION (B) SHALL NOT APPLY.]

- 1 (H) WEEKLY DRAWING CARRYOVER EXCEPTION. -- WEEKLY DRAWINGS
- 2 SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE PRIZE LIMITATION CONTAINED IN
- 3 SUBSECTION [(B)] (A). THE PRIZE LIMITATION CONTAINED IN
- 4 SUBSECTION [(B)] (A) MAY BE EXCEEDED BY A WEEKLY DRAWING UNDER
- 5 THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES: A WEEKLY DRAWING MAY AWARD A PRIZE
- 6 WHERE THE CASH VALUE IS IN EXCESS OF [\$35,000] \$14,000 IF SUCH
- 7 PRIZE IS THE RESULT OF A CARRYOVER OF A DRAWING OR DRAWINGS
- 8 WHICH RESULTED FROM THE WINNING NUMBER OR NUMBERS IN SUCH
- 9 DRAWING OR DRAWINGS NOT BEING AMONG THE ELIGIBLE ENTRANTS IN
- 10 SUCH DRAWINGS. NOTHING CONTAINED IN THIS CHAPTER SHALL AUTHORIZE
- 11 THE PRIZE LIMITATION UNDER SUBSECTION [(B)] (A) TO BE EXCEEDED
- 12 AS A RESULT OF A FAILURE TO CONDUCT A DRAWING FOR A WEEK DURING
- 13 WHICH CHANCES WERE SOLD FOR A WEEKLY DRAWING OR FOR A WEEKLY
- 14 DRAWING FOR WHICH CHANCES WERE SOLD IN EXCESS OF \$1.
- 15 (I) CONCURRENT OPERATION. -- NOTHING UNDER THIS ACT SHALL
- 16 PROHIBIT THE CONCURRENT OPERATION OF DAILY OR WEEKLY DRAWINGS.
- 17 Section $\frac{3}{4}$. The act is amended by adding a section to read: <--
- 18 Section 304.2. Airport 50/50 drawing.
- 19 <u>(a) General rule.--A person may purchase one or more airport</u>
- 20 50/50 drawing tickets, and each ticket shall represent one entry
- 21 in the drawing for a winner. A single ticket shall be randomly
- 22 chosen as the winner after a certain number of tickets are sold
- 23 or a specified time period expires, as designated by the
- 24 <u>airport</u>. Purchase of airport 50/50 drawing tickets may be made
- 25 by cash, credit card or debit card.
- 26 (b) Frequency and location. -- An airport 50/50 drawing may be
- 27 <u>conducted at an airport no more than one time per calendar day.</u>
- 28 Drawings may only be held within the spaces of an airport
- 29 terminal to which the general public, including ticketed
- 30 passengers, regularly has access.

- 1 (c) Distribution. -- The prize amount of an airport 50/50
- 2 drawing shall be 50% of the total amount collected from the sale
- 3 of airport 50/50 drawing tickets. The other 50% of the total
- 4 amount collected from the sale of airport 50/50 drawing tickets
- 5 shall be donated within seven days from the date of the drawing
- 6 by the airport to the designated charitable organization for
- 7 which the drawing was conducted.
- 8 (d) Designated charitable organization. -- The identity of the
- 9 designated charitable organization for which the airport 50/50
- 10 drawing is being conducted shall be disclosed to all ticket
- 11 <u>purchasers</u>.
- 12 (e) Eligibility. -- In order to receive proceeds from an
- 13 <u>airport 50/50 drawing</u>, a charitable organization must be in
- 14 <u>existence and fulfill its purposes prior to the airport 50/50</u>
- 15 drawing and shall be eligible for exemption under section 501(c)
- 16 (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26
- 17 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)). A political subdivision shall not qualify
- 18 as a charitable organization under this act, but an organization
- 19 formed by a political subdivision that is eliqible for exemption
- 20 under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986
- 21 <u>shall qualify as a charitable organization under this act.</u>
- 22 (f) Unclaimed prizes.--Any airport 50/50 drawing prize
- 23 remaining unclaimed by a winner 180 days after the drawing shall
- 24 be donated to the designated charitable organization for which
- 25 the airport 50/50 drawing was conducted.
- 26 (q) Applicability. -- The limitations under sections 302,
- 27 303(b), 308 and 704 shall not apply to an airport 50/50 drawing.
- 28 (h) Additional recordkeeping. -- The department may require
- 29 <u>additional recordkeeping or accountability measures for airport</u>
- $30 \quad 50/50 \text{ drawings.}$

- 1 Section 4 5. Sections 307(d.1), 501(a)(1), 502(a.1)(1) and <-
- 2 702(g) of the act are amended to read:
- 3 Section 307. Licensing of eligible organizations.
- 4 * * *
- 5 (d.1) Bank account and records. -- An eligible organization
- 6 with proceeds of games of chance that exceed [\$40,000] \$60,000
- 7 per year shall maintain a bank account, which shall be separate
- 8 from all other funds belonging to the licensed eligible
- 9 organization. Account records shall show all expenditures and
- 10 income and shall be retained by the licensed eligible
- 11 organization for at least two years.

- 13 Section 501. Club licensee.
- 14 (a) Report.--
- 15 (1) Beginning in 2014, a club licensee with proceeds in
- 16 excess of [\$20,000] \$30,000 in a calendar year shall submit
- 17 annual reports to the department for the preceding 12-month
- 18 period on a form and in a manner prescribed by the
- 19 department.

- 21 Section 502. Distribution of proceeds.

- 23 (a.1) Amounts retained.--
- 24 (1) Notwithstanding subsection (a), if in a calendar
- year beginning January 1, 2013, the proceeds from a game of
- chance for a club licensee are [\$40,000] \$60,000 or less, the
- 27 licensee shall be eligible to retain the first [\$20,000]
- 28 \$30,000 in proceeds in the following calendar year before
- 29 subsection (a) applies.

- 2 * * *
- 3 (g) [General rule] <u>Violations of Liquor Code</u>.--
- 4 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), a violation of 5 this act by a club licensee shall not constitute a violation
- 6 of the Liquor Code.
- 7 (2) If a club licensee has committed three or more
- 8 violations of this act, the Bureau of Liquor Control
- 9 Enforcement may enforce a violation of this act as a
- 10 violation of the Liquor Code.
- 11 (3) A violation of this act shall not constitute a
- violation of the Liquor Code for the purposes of section
- 13 471(c) of the Liquor Code.
- 14 (4) A violation of section 304.1 or 304.2 shall not
- constitute a violation of the Liquor Code.
- 16 Section $\frac{5}{6}$ 6. Within two years of the effective date of this \leftarrow --
- 17 section, the Department of Revenue shall publish regulations to
- 18 implement and administer the provisions of this act.
- 19 Section $\frac{6}{7}$. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
