AN ACT

- Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania
 Consolidated Statutes, in lobbying disclosure, further
- providing for registration, for reporting, for prohibited activities, for penalties and for registration fees, fund
- 5 established, system and regulations.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Sections 13A04(a), (d) and (e)(1), 13A05(a), (b)
- 9 (4), (6) and (8) and (d), 13A07(f)(2), 13A09(c)(1) and 13A10(c)
- 10 of Title 65 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are
- 11 amended to read:
- 12 § 13A04. Registration.
- 13 (a) General rule. -- Unless excluded under section 13A06
- 14 (relating to exemption from registration and reporting), a
- 15 lobbyist, lobbying firm or a principal must register with the
- 16 department <u>electronically using the computerized filing system</u>
- 17 <u>developed by the department that is consistent with the purposes</u>
- 18 of this chapter within ten days of acting in any capacity as a
- 19 lobbyist, lobbying firm or principal. Registration shall be

- 1 biennial and shall begin January 1, 2007.
- 2 * * *
- 3 (d) Amendments.--
- 4 (1) If there is a change of information required for the
- 5 registration statement under subsection (b)(1) or (2) or (c),
- an amended registration statement shall be filed with the
- department electronically using the computerized filing
- 8 system developed by the department that is consistent with
- 9 <u>the purpose of this chapter</u> within 14 days after the change
- 10 occurs.
- 11 (2) When there is a change in information required for
- the registration statement under subsection (b) (3), an
- amended registration statement shall be filed with the
- department <u>electronically using the computerized filing</u>
- system developed by the department that is consistent with
- the purpose of this chapter within 14 days of the end of the
- 17 year in which the change occurs.
- 18 (e) Termination.--
- 19 (1) A lobbyist, lobbying firm or principal may terminate
- 20 registration by filing notice of termination with the
- 21 department[.] electronically using the computerized filing
- 22 system developed by the department that is consistent with
- the purpose of this chapter.

- 25 § 13A05. Reporting.
- 26 (a) General rule. -- A registered principal shall, under oath
- 27 or affirmation, file quarterly expense reports with the
- 28 department electronically using the computerized filing system
- 29 developed by the department that is consistent with the purpose
- 30 of this chapter no later than 30 days after the last day of the

1 quarter.

2 (b) Content.--

3 * * *

(4) A lobbying firm or a lobbyist not associated with a lobbying firm shall sign the reports <u>electronically</u> submitted by each principal for whom the lobbying firm or lobbyist is registered to attest to the validity and accuracy to the best of the attestor's knowledge. A lobbying firm or lobbyist may attach a statement to the <u>electronic</u> report of a principal, describing the limits of the knowledge of the lobbying firm or lobbyist concerning the information contained in the expense report.

(6) A lobbying firm or a lobbyist not associated with a lobbying firm shall submit an expense report electronically using the computerized filing system developed by the department that is consistent with the purpose of this chapter if during the reporting period the lobbying firm or lobbyist engaged in lobbying which was not contained in any expense report filed by a principal or principals represented.

(8) A lobbying firm or a lobbyist not associated with a lobbying firm shall submit a report electronically using the computerized filing system developed by the department that is consistent with the purpose of this chapter if the lobbying firm or lobbyist engaged in lobbying on behalf of any entity that is exempt under section 13A06(7), (8), (9) or (10) (relating to exemption from registration and reporting).

- 1 (d) Thresholds for reporting. -- An expense report required
- 2 under this section shall be filed <u>electronically using the</u>
- 3 computerized filing system developed by the department that is
- 4 <u>consistent with the purpose of this chapter</u> when total expenses
- 5 for lobbying exceed \$2,500 for a registered principal in a
- 6 reporting period. In a reporting period in which total expenses
- 7 are \$2,500 or less, a statement to that effect shall be filed
- 8 <u>electronically using the computerized filing system developed by</u>
- 9 the department that is consistent with the purpose of this
- 10 chapter.

- 12 § 13A07. Prohibited activities.
- 13 * * *
- 14 (f) Unlawful acts.--
- 15 * * *
- 16 (2) The commission may receive complaints regarding
- 17 violations of this subsection. If the commission determines a
- 18 violation of this subsection has occurred, the commission,
- 19 after investigation, notice and hearing:
- 20 (i) shall impose an administrative penalty in an
- amount not to exceed [\$2,000] \$4,000; and
- 22 (ii) may prohibit a lobbyist from lobbying for
- economic consideration for up to five years.

- 25 § 13A09. Penalties.
- 26 * * *
- 27 (c) Negligent failure to register or report.--
- 28 (1) Negligent failure to register or report as required
- by this chapter is punishable by an administrative penalty
- not exceeding [\$50 for each late day.] the following:

- (i) For the first ten late days, \$50 for each late
- 2 <u>day.</u>
- 3 <u>(ii) For each late day after the first ten late days</u>
- 4 through the 20th late day, \$100 for each late day.
- 5 <u>(iii) For each late day after the first 20 late</u>
- 6 <u>days, \$200 for each late day.</u>

- 8 § 13A10. Registration fees; fund established; system;
- 9 regulations.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (c) Computerized filing system. -- The department shall
- 12 implement a fully accessible system to accommodate the use of
- 13 computerized filing. [Each registrant shall elect on an annual
- 14 basis whether the registrant will file all of the documents
- 15 required by this chapter either electronically or on paper with
- 16 the department.] The department shall post all filings on its
- 17 publicly accessible Internet website within seven days of
- 18 receipt of the filing.

- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 21 (1) The amendment of 65 Pa.C.S. §§ 13A04(a), (d) and (e)
- 22 (1) and 13A05(a), (b)(4), (6) and (8) and (d) shall take
- 23 effect January 1, 2018.
- 24 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect
- 25 immediately.
