## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in pupils and attendance, providing for school building closure requirements.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
11	section to read:
12	<u>Section 1311.1. School Building Closure Requirements(a)</u>
13	<u>A school entity may close a school voluntarily, through</u>
14	nonrenewal or through revocation as provided under section 1729-
15	A. Notice of a school entity's closure of a school for any
16	reason must be provided by the authorizing entity to the
17	Department of Education. After receiving notification of
18	closure, the department shall notify the school entity and the
19	authorizing entity if it is aware of any liabilities the school
20	entity owes the Commonwealth or any other entity. Liabilities

1	may include overpayment of tuition, unpaid revolving fund loans
2	or grants or other liabilities. The department may ask the
3	Auditor General or city controller of a city of the first class
4	to conduct an audit of the school entity if it has reason to
5	believe that the school entity received State funding for which
6	it was not eligible. The notice of the school entity shall
7	include an accounting of the following:
8	(1) All financial assets, including, but not limited to,
9	cash and accounts receivable and an inventory of property,
10	equipment and other items of material value.
11	(2) All liabilities, including, but not limited to, accounts
12	payable, unpaid staff compensation, audit findings or other
13	investigations.
14	(3) An assessment of the disposition of any restricted funds
15	received by or due to the school entity.
16	(b) If the school entity is supported by a nonprofit
17	foundation and the foundation does not have any other functions
18	than operation of the school entity, the foundation should be
19	dissolved according to its bylaws. The foundation's bylaws
20	should address how assets are to be distributed at the closure
21	of the foundation. All remaining assets of the foundation shall
22	be distributed on a proportional basis to school districts with
23	students enrolled in the school for the last full or partial
24	school year of the school.
25	(c) (1) The school entity shall send notice of its closure
26	of a school to parents or guardians of students, the authorizing
27	entity and the department. Notice must be received by the
28	department within fifteen (15) calendar days of any official
29	action taken by the authorizing entity. Notification of all the
30	required parties shall include at least the following:
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1	(i) The effective date of the closure.
2	(ii) The name and contact information for the person
3	handling inquiries regarding the closure.
4	(iii) The students' school districts of residence.
5	(iv) How parents or guardians may obtain copies of student
6	records, including specific information on completed courses and
7	credits that meet graduation requirements.
8	(2) The notification to the department shall also include a
9	description of the circumstances of the closure and the location
10	of student and personnel records. Notification to parents,
11	guardians and students shall also include information on how to
12	transfer the student to an appropriate school and a certified
13	packet of student information that may include grade reports,
14	discipline records, immunization records and any other
15	appropriate information.
16	(d) The school entity or authorizing entity shall announce
17	the closure of a school to school districts that may be
