AN ACT

Designating a bridge on that portion of Pennsylvania Route 53 over U.S. Route 22, Cresson Township, Cambria County as the 2 Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., Memorial Bridge. 3 4 The General Assembly finds that: Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., was born in the City of Altoona, Blair County, on September 5, 1947, and 7 enlisted in the United States Marine Corps during the Vietnam 8 War. 9 On April 3, 1967, Corporal Sherwood made the 10 ultimate sacrifice for his country. While on patrol, his unit 11 came under enemy fire and he was mortally wounded helping 12 load injured Marines into a medical helicopter. 13 For his service to the United States Marine Corps, 14 Corporal Sherwood received the following medals and ribbons: 15 Paratrooper Wings, Purple Heart Medal, National Defense 16 Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and Sharpshooter badge.

- 2 Section 1. Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., Memorial Bridge.
- 3 (a) Designation. -- The bridge located on Pennsylvania Route
- 4 53 in Cresson Township, Cambria County over U.S. Route 22 is
- 5 hereby designated the Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., Memorial
- 6 Bridge.
- 7 (b) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 8 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 9 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 10 Section 2. Effective date.
- 11 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
