## AN ACT

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for 3 classes of offenses; in authorized disposition of offenders, 4 further providing for sentence of imprisonment for misdemeanors; and, in sentencing, providing for modification 6 of sentences for certain misdemeanors. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Sections 106(b)(8) and (d) and 1104 of Title 18 10 11 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: § 106. Classes of offenses. 12 13 14 (b) Classification of crimes. --\* \* \* 15 16 (8) A crime is a misdemeanor of the third degree if it 17 is so designated in this title or if a person convicted 18 thereof may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment, the 19 maximum of which is not more than [one year] three hundred sixty four days. 20

- 2 (d) Other crimes.--
- 3 (1) Any offense declared by law to constitute a crime,
- 4 <u>without specification of the class thereof, and for which the</u>
- 5 <u>law declares a term of imprisonment of one year or not to</u>
- 6 <u>exceed one year, the phrase "one year" as used in that law</u>
- 7 shall mean 364 days.
- 8 (2) Any offense declared by law to constitute a crime,
- 9 without specification of the class thereof, is a misdemeanor
- of the second degree, if the maximum sentence does not make
- it a felony under this section.

- 13 § 1104. Sentence of imprisonment for misdemeanors.
- 14 A person who has been convicted of a misdemeanor may be
- 15 sentenced to imprisonment for a definite term which shall be
- 16 fixed by the court and shall be not more than:
- 17 (1) Five years in the case of a misdemeanor of the first
- 18 degree.
- 19 (2) Two years in the case of a misdemeanor of the second
- degree.
- 21 (3) [One year] Three hundred sixty four days in the case
- of a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 23 Section 2. Title 42 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 24 § 9778. Modification of sentences for certain misdemeanors.
- 25 (a) General rule. -- A person who was convicted of a
- 26 misdemeanor of the third degree or an ungraded misdemeanor
- 27 before July 1, 2017, and sentenced to a term of imprisonment of
- 28 one year or not to exceed one year, may file a petition with a
- 29 court of common pleas requesting that the court order that the
- 30 person's original sentence be modified to a sentence of 364 days

- 1 or not to exceed 364 days, as applicable.
- 2 (b) Right of modification. -- No person has a right to
- 3 modification of a sentence under this section.
- 4 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
