6	<u>§ 1301. Definitions.</u>								
7	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter								
8	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the								
9	context clearly indicates otherwise:								
10	"Agency." The Governor and a department, board, commission,								
11	authority and other officer and agency of the Commonwealth. The								
12	term does not include a court or other officer or agency of the								
13	unified judicial system, the General Assembly and its officers								
14	and agencies or an independent agency or State-affiliated								
15	entity.								
16	"Covered document." As follows:								
17	(1) A document that:								
18	(i) is necessary for obtaining a State government								
19	benefit or service or for filing taxes;								
20	(ii) provides information about a State government								
21	<u>benefit or service; or</u>								
22	(iii) explains to the public how to comply with a								
23	requirement the State government administers or enforces.								
24	(2) The term includes, in paper or electronic form, a								
25	letter, publication, form, notice or instruction.								
26	(3) The term does not include a regulation.								
27	"Plain writing." Writing that is clear, concise, well-								
28	organized and follows other best practices appropriate to the								
29	subject or field and intended audience.								
30	<u>§ 1302. Duties.</u>								
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1	(a) Preparation
2	(1) No later than nine months after the effective date
3	of this section, the head of each agency shall do the
4	<u>following:</u>
5	(i) Designate at least one senior official within
6	the agency to oversee the agency implementation of this
7	<u>chapter.</u>
8	(ii) Communicate the requirements of this chapter to
9	the employees of the agency.
10	(iii) Train the employees of the agency in plain
11	writing.
12	(iv) Establish a process for overseeing the ongoing
13	compliance of the agency with the requirements of this
14	<u>chapter.</u>
15	(v) Create and maintain a plain writing section of
16	the agency's website as required under paragraph (2) that
17	is accessible from the homepage of the agency's website.
18	(vi) Designate at least one agency point-of-contact
19	to receive and respond to public input on the following:
20	(A) Agency implementation of this chapter.
21	(B) The agency reports required under section
22	1303 (relating to reports).
23	(2) The plain writing section of the agency's website
24	described under paragraph (1)(v) shall do the following:
25	(i) Inform the public of agency compliance with the
26	requirements of this chapter.
27	(ii) Provide a mechanism for the agency to receive
28	and respond to public input on the following:
29	(A) Agency implementation of this chapter.
30	(B) The agency reports required under section

2	(b) Plain writing in new documentsNo later than one year							
3	after the effective date of this section, each agency shall use							
4	plain writing in each covered document of the agency that the							
5	agency issues or substantially revises.							
6	(c) Guidance							
7	(1) No later than six months after the effective date of							
8	this section, the Office of Administration shall develop and							
9	issue guidance on implementing the requirements of this							
10	section. The Office of Administration may designate a lead							
11	agency and may use interagency working groups to assist in							
12	developing and issuing the guidance.							
13	(2) Before the issuance of guidance under paragraph (1),							
14	an agency may follow the guidance of one of the following:							
15	(i) The writing guidelines developed by the Plain							
16	Language Action and Information Network.							
17	(ii) Guidance provided by the head of the agency							
18	that is consistent with the guidelines referred to under							
19	<u>subparagraph (i).</u>							
20	<u>§ 1303. Reports.</u>							
21	(a) Initial reportNo later than nine months after the							
22	effective date of this section, the head of each agency shall							
23	publish on the plain writing section of the agency's website a							
24	report that describes the agency plan for compliance with the							
25	requirements of this chapter.							
26	(b) Annual compliance reportNo later than 18 months after							
27	the effective date of this section, and annually thereafter, the							
28	head of each agency shall publish on the plain writing section							
29	of the agency's website a report on agency compliance with the							
30	requirements of this chapter.
