## AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), entitled "An act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and 2 consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of 3 insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and supervision of insurance carried by such companies, 7 8 associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by 9 10 the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and repealing existing laws," in casualty insurance, providing 11 for coverage for treatment for autoimmune neuropsychiatric 12 disorders associated with streptococcal infections and 13 pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome. 14 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 16 hereby enacts as follows: 17 Section 1. The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known 18 as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, is amended by adding a 19 section to read: 2.0 Section 635.8. Coverage for Treatment of Pediatric 21 Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Disorders Associated with 22 Streptococcal Infections and Pediatric Acute Onset 23 Neuropsychiatric Syndrome. -- (a) A group or individual policy of
- 24 health and accident insurance or managed care plan that is

- 1 <u>amended</u>, <u>delivered</u>, <u>issued or renewed after the effective date</u>
- 2 of this section shall provide coverage for treatment of
- 3 <u>pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with</u>
- 4 <u>streptococcal infection and pediatric acute onset</u>
- 5 <u>neuropsychiatric syndrome, including the use of intravenous</u>
- 6 immunoglobulin therapy.
- 7 (b) If, at any time, the United States Secretary of Health
- 8 and Human Services, or a successor officer, promulgates rules or
- 9 regulations to be published in the Federal Register or publishes
- 10 a comment in the Federal Register or issues an opinion,
- 11 guidance, or other action that would require the Commonwealth,
- 12 <u>under any provision of the Patient Protection and Affordable</u>
- 13 <u>Care Act (Public Law 111-148, 124 Stat. 119), including 42</u>
- 14 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 18031(d)(3)(B) (relating to affordable choices of
- 15 <u>health benefits</u>) or any successor provision, to defray the cost
- 16 of any coverage for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric
- 17 disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric
- 18 <u>acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome outlined in this section</u>,
- 19 then the requirement that an insurer cover pediatric autoimmune
- 20 <u>neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal</u>
- 21 infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome
- 22 <u>is inoperative other than any coverage authorized under section</u>
- 23 1902 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. § 1396a), and the
- 24 Commonwealth shall not assume any obligation for the cost of
- 25 coverage for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders
- 26 <u>associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute</u>
- 27 onset neuropsychiatric syndrome.
- 28 <u>(c) As used in this section:</u>
- 29 (1) "Pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome" means
- 30 <u>a clinical diagnosis given to children who have a sudden onset</u>

- 1 of neuropsychiatric symptoms, including obsessive-compulsive
- 2 disorder and restricted food intake.
- 3 (2) "Pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders
- 4 <u>associated with streptococcal infections" means a clinical</u>
- 5 <u>diagnosis given to children who develop a sudden onset of</u>
- 6 <u>obsessive-compulsive disorder or involuntary purposeless</u>
- 7 movements as a result of a streptococcal infection.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
