AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), entitled
2 "An act relating to the manufacture, sale and possession of
3 controlled substances, other drugs, devices and cosmetics;
4 conferring powers on the courts and the secretary and
5 Department of Health, and a newly created Pennsylvania Drug,
6 Device and Cosmetic Board; establishing schedules of
7 controlled substances; providing penalties; requiring
8 registration of persons engaged in the drug trade and for the
9 revocation or suspension of certain licenses and
10 registrations; and repealing an act," further providing for
11 drug overdose response immunity.

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13 hereby enacts as follows:

14 Section 1. Section 13.7(c) of the act of April 14, 1972
15 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug,
16 Device and Cosmetic Act, is amended to read:

17 Section 13.7. Drug Overdose Response Immunity.--* * *

18 (c) [Persons] A person experiencing a drug overdose [events]
19 event may not be charged and shall be immune from prosecution as
20 provided in subsection (b) if [a person who]:

21 (1) another person against whom probable cause exists to

1 charge an offense listed in subsection (b) or a violation of
2 parole or probation transported or reported and remained with
3 [them may not be charged] the person experiencing the drug
4 overdose; and

5 (2) the other person is entitled to immunity under this
6 section.

7 * * *

8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
