## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in public assistance,
- 4 providing for work requirements.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 8 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 9 read:
- 10 <u>Section 441.10. Work Requirements.--(a) No later than March</u>
- 11 1 of each year, the secretary shall apply to the Centers for
- 12 Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States Department
- 13 of Health and Human Services for a waiver under section 1315 of
- 14 the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1315) for the
- 15 following purposes:
- 16 (1) Instituting a work requirement for a Medicaid enrollee
- 17 who is eighteen years of age or older and physically and
- 18 mentally capable of work. The work requirement shall require a

- 1 Medicaid enrollee to become employed, actively seek employment
- 2 as verified by the department or attend a job training program
- 3 in accordance with the following:
- 4 (i) In the case of a Medicaid enrollee who is employed or
- 5 attending job training programs in order to maintain enrollment
- 6 in the Medicaid program, the Medicaid enrollee shall work twenty
- 7 hours a week or complete twelve job training program-related
- 8 <u>activities a month.</u>
- 9 (ii) A Medicaid enrollee who complies with the work
- 10 requirement under subparagraph (i) may have Medicaid premiums or
- 11 cost-sharing reduced or other incentives beginning in year two
- 12 <u>of employment.</u>
- 13 (iii) A Medicaid enrollee who has failed to comply with the
- 14 work requirement under subparagraph (i) shall relinquish
- 15 Medicaid program eligibility for the following time periods:
- 16 (A) Three months beginning in year two of employment.
- 17 (B) Six months beginning after the time period under clause
- 18 (A) expires.
- 19 (C) Nine months beginning after the time period under clause
- 20 (B) expires.
- 21 (2) Requiring an able-bodied Medicaid enrollee who is
- 22 eighteen years of age or older to verify on a biannual basis or
- 23 by request of the department the Medicaid enrollee's family
- 24 income or the Medicaid enrollee's compliance with the provisions
- 25 under paragraph (1) for the purpose of determining the Medicaid
- 26 enrollee's eligibility.
- 27 (3) Banning an individual from enrolling in a Medicaid
- 28 program if the individual has failed to comply with paragraphs
- (1) and (2).
- 30 (4) Exempting a Medicaid enrollee from the requirements

- 1 under paragraphs (1) and (2) under any of the following
- 2 conditions:
- 3 (i) The Medicaid enrollee is attending high school as a
- 4 <u>full-time student.</u>
- 5 (ii) The Medicaid enrollee is currently receiving temporary
- 6 or permanent long-term disability benefits.
- 7 (iii) The Medicaid enrollee is an individual twenty years of
- 8 age or younger or sixty-five years of age or older.
- 9 <u>(iv) The Medicaid enrollee is a pregnant woman.</u>
- 10 (v) The Medicaid enrollee receives Supplemental Security
- 11 <u>Income (SSI) benefits.</u>
- 12 (vi) The Medicaid enrollee resides in a mental health
- 13 <u>institution or correctional institution</u>.
- 14 (vii) The Medicaid enrollee is experiencing a crisis,
- 15 serious medical condition or temporary condition that prevents
- 16 the Medicaid enrollee from actively seeking employment, such as
- 17 domestic violence or substance abuse treatment.
- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
