AN ACT

- 1 Providing for release of information by coroners and medical examiners.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Release of
- 7 Coroner and Medical Examiner Information Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "County." A county of the first class, second class, second
- 13 class A, third class, fourth class, fifth class, sixth class,
- 14 seventh class or eighth class, including a county within which a
- 15 city of the first class is located or with which a city of the
- 16 first class is coextensive.
- 17 Section 3. Investigation information.

- 1 (a) General rule. -- Except as provided in subsection (b),
- 2 following an investigation by a coroner or medical examiner to
- 3 determine the cause and manner of a death within the coroner's
- 4 or medical examiner's jurisdiction, the coroner or medical
- 5 examiner shall not disclose to the public the name of the
- 6 deceased nor the cause and manner of death unless:
- 7 (1) The release is in accordance with the requirements
- 8 under subsection (b) or section 5.
- 9 (2) The information to be released does not detail the
- 10 medical, psychiatric or psychological history, disability
- 11 status or test results, including drug test results, of the
- deceased.
- 13 (3) The release does not jeopardize an official
- investigation and the information released is not privileged
- or confidential under the laws of this Commonwealth or is in
- 16 compliance with a court order.
- 17 (b) Public health or safety emergencies. -- Notwithstanding
- 18 the provisions of subsection (a), a coroner or medical examiner
- 19 may release to the public the name of the deceased and the cause
- 20 and manner of death at any time if the coroner or medical
- 21 examiner determines that the release is necessary to avert a
- 22 public health or safety emergency.
- 23 Section 4. Limitation of liability.
- 24 (a) General rule. -- A coroner or medical examiner who acts in
- 25 good faith in accordance with the provisions of this act shall
- 26 not be subject to criminal or civil liability arising from any
- 27 action under this act.
- 28 (b) Nonapplicability. -- The immunity provided by subsection
- 29 (a) shall not apply to acts of gross negligence or recklessness.
- 30 Section 5. Construction.

- 1 Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit a coroner
- 2 or medical examiner from releasing information to the public if
- 3 the identity of the deceased or the next of kin is unknown and
- 4 the following:
- 5 (1) The information is necessary to find the next of kin
- for purpose of notification under section 3.
- 7 (2) The information consists only of the following:
- 8 (i) Name, if known.
- 9 (ii) Gender.
- 10 (iii) Race.
- 11 (iv) Age.
- 12 (v) Date the deceased was found.
- 13 (vi) Sketch.
- 14 (vii) Any information the coroner and medical
- examiner deem necessary.
- 16 (3) The information does not jeopardize an official
- 17 investigation.
- 18 (4) The information is not privileged or confidential
- under the laws of this Commonwealth or pursuant to a court
- 20 order.
- 21 Section 6. Applicability.
- This act shall apply in each county of this Commonwealth.
- 23 Section 7. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
