AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, providing for career information and recruitment.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
11	section to read:
12	Section 127. Career Information and Recruitment(a)
13	Subject to subsection (b), a school entity shall consider all <
14	career presenters in the same manner as follows:
15	(1) School entities shall seek participation of
16	representatives of skilled trades, area career and technical

1	education schools, institutions of higher education, business,
2	industry, charitable institutions or other employers regarding
3	employment, employment training or education opportunities.
4	(2) The recruitment of students by the representatives
5	specified in paragraph (1).
6	(b) A school entity shall provide the following to the
7	representatives specified in subsection (a)(1):
8	(1) Equal access to the school district's employment or
9	placement services.
10	(2) At least one opportunity during the school year to
11	provide age appropriate career information to all students in
12	grades four through twelve individually or in a group setting.
13	If currently on school grounds, representatives may be given the
14	opportunity to speak with students in person.
15	(c) Each school entity shall document annually the school
16	entity's compliance with this section including how the school
17	entity will provide students with access to informational
18	materials and career presenters in the plan developed under 22
19	Pa. Code § 339.31 (relating to plan). Each school entity shall
20	post the plan on the school entity's publicly accessible
21	Internet website. A SCHOOL ENTITY THAT CONDUCTS A CAREER FAIR OR <
22	OTHER INFORMATIONAL SESSION ON OCCUPATIONS FOR STUDENTS SHALL
23	MAKE AN EFFORT TO PROVIDE INFORMATION ON A WIDE RANGE OF
24	POTENTIAL CAREERS BY SEEKING INFORMATION FROM ORGANIZATIONS SUCH
25	<u>AS:</u>
26	(1) A LOCAL CHAMBER OF BUSINESS OR INDUSTRY;
27	(2) A LOCAL LABOR OR TRADE ORGANIZATION;
28	(3) AN AREA CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION SCHOOL;
29	(4) AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION;
30	(5) A NONPROFIT OR CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION; AND

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1	(6) THE UNITED STATES ARMED SERVICES.	
2	(B) EACH SCHOOL ENTITY SHALL POST A PLAN FOR PROVIDING	
3	CAREER INFORMATION AND THE ORGANIZATIONS CONTACTED ON THE SCHOOL	_
4	ENTITY'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE.	
5	(C) The Department of Education, in collaboration with	<
6	the Department of Labor and Industry, shall develop standard	
7	informational materials which include, but are not limited to, a	_
8	summary of regional workforce needs, career cluster occupations,	_
9	high-priority occupations, training opportunities and future	
10	earning potential. The materials shall be reviewed and updated	
11	annually. Each school entity shall ensure the distribution	<
12	AVAILABILITY of these materials during the school year and at	<
13	any scheduled educational or career fair.	
14	(D) For the purposes of this section, the following	<
15	terms shall have the following meanings given to them in this	
16	subsection:	
17	"Institution of higher education." An accredited entity	
18	which is any of the following:	
19	(1) A community college operating under Article XIX-A.	
20	(2) A university within the State System of Higher	
21	Education.	
22	(3) The Pennsylvania State University, the University of	
23	Pittsburgh, Temple University, Lincoln University or any other	
24	institution designated as State-related by the Commonwealth.	
25	(4) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.	
26	(5) A college established under Article XIX-G.	
27	(6) An institution of higher education located in and	
28	incorporated or chartered by the Commonwealth and entitled to	
29	confer degrees as specified in 24 Pa.C.S. § 6505 (relating to	
30	power to confer degrees) and as provided for by the standards	
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1	and qualifications prescribed by the State Board of Education
2	under 24 Pa.C.S. Ch. 65 (relating to private colleges,
3	universities and seminaries).
4	(7) A private school licensed under the act of December 15,
5	1986 (P.L.1585, No.174), known as the Private Licensed Schools
6	<u>Act.</u>
7	(8) A foreign corporation approved to operate an educational
8	enterprise under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 36 (relating to foreign
9	corporation standards).
10	"School entity." An area vocational-technical school, school
11	district, intermediate unit, cyber charter school, charter
12	<u>school or regional charter school.</u>
13	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
