AN ACT

1 Amending the act of February 15, 2018 (P.L.22, No.9), entitled
2 "An act designating a portion of State Route 2005 in
3 Saxonburg Borough, Butler County, as the Chief Gregory B.
4 Adams Way; designating a bridge on that portion of
5 Pennsylvania Route 271 over US Route 22, Jackson Township,
6 Cambria County, as the Trooper Gary Fisher Memorial Bridge;
7 designating a bridge on that portion of Pennsylvania Route 53
8 over US Route 22, Cresson Township, Cambria County, as the
9 Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., Memorial Bridge;
10 designating a bridge on Segment 80 of State Route 2015, along
11 Overbridge Street and over Railroad Street, Lilly Borough,
12 Cambria County, as the Paul E. Sweeney Memorial Bridge;
13 designating a bridge on that portion of Avenue A over the
14 Allegheny River, Coudersport Borough, Potter County, as the
15 Commander Philip F. "Jet" Palmatier, Jr., Memorial Bridge;
16 designating a bridge on that portion of Sunnyside Road over
17 the Oswayo Creek, Shinglehouse Borough, Potter County, as the
18 PVT Malon Stanley Memorial Bridge; designating a portion of
19 State Route 1001 in Greene Township, Franklin County, as the
20 Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr., Memorial Highway;
21 designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 533 over
22 Muddy Run, Southampton Township, Franklin County, as the
23 Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl Memorial Bridge; and
24 designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 1004 over
25 the Conococheague Creek, Greene Township, Franklin County, as
26 the Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher Memorial Bridge," further
27 providing for Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr.,
28 Memorial Highway-; AND PROVIDING FOR CPL. CARL F. HYNEK III <--
29 MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

30 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

31 hereby enacts as follows:

1 Section 1. The title of the act of February 15, 2018
2 (P.L.22, No.9), entitled "An act designating a portion of State
3 Route 2005 in Saxonburg Borough, Butler County, as the Chief
4 Gregory B. Adams Way; designating a bridge on that portion of
5 Pennsylvania Route 271 over US Route 22, Jackson Township,
6 Cambria County, as the Trooper Gary Fisher Memorial Bridge;
7 designating a bridge on that portion of Pennsylvania Route 53
8 over US Route 22, Cresson Township, Cambria County, as the
9 Corporal Robert J. Sherwood, Jr., Memorial Bridge; designating a
10 bridge on Segment 80 of State Route 2015, along Overbridge
11 Street and over Railroad Street, Lilly Borough, Cambria County,
12 as the Paul E. Sweeney Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on
13 that portion of Avenue A over the Allegheny River, Coudersport
14 Borough, Potter County, as the Commander Philip F. "Jet"
15 Palmatier, Jr., Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that
16 portion of Sunnyside Road over the Oswayo Creek, Shinglehouse
17 Borough, Potter County, as the PVT Malon Stanley Memorial
18 Bridge; designating a portion of State Route 1001 in Greene
19 Township, Franklin County, as the Lance Corporal Michael L.
20 Freeman, Jr., Memorial Highway; designating a bridge on that
21 portion of State Route 533 over Muddy Run, Southampton Township,
22 Franklin County, as the Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl
23 Memorial Bridge; and designating a bridge on that portion of
24 State Route 1004 over the Conococheague Creek, Greene Township,
25 Franklin County, as the Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher Memorial
26 Bridge," is amended to read:

27 AN ACT

28 Designating a portion of State Route 2005 in Saxonburg Borough,
29 Butler County, as the Chief Gregory B. Adams Way; designating
30 a bridge on that portion of Pennsylvania Route 271 over US

1 Route 22, Jackson Township, Cambria County, as the Trooper
2 Gary Fisher Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that
3 portion of Pennsylvania Route 53 over US Route 22, Cresson
4 Township, Cambria County, as the Corporal Robert J. Sherwood,
5 Jr., Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on Segment 80 of
6 State Route 2015, along Overbridge Street and over Railroad
7 Street, Lilly Borough, Cambria County, as the Paul E. Sweeney
8 Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of
9 Avenue A over the Allegheny River, Coudersport Borough,
10 Potter County, as the Commander Philip F. "Jet" Palmatier,
11 Jr., Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of
12 Sunnyside Road over the Oswayo Creek, Shinglehouse Borough,
13 Potter County, as the PVT Malon Stanley Memorial Bridge;
14 designating a portion of [State Route 1001 in Greene
15 Township,] U.S. Route 30 in Franklin County, as the Lance
16 Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr., Memorial Highway;
17 designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 533 over
18 Muddy Run, Southampton Township, Franklin County, as the
19 Private First Class Dana Edward Diehl Memorial Bridge; ~~and~~ <--
20 designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 1004 over
21 the Conococheague Creek, Greene Township, Franklin County, as
22 the Private Charles W. "Bill" Roher Memorial Bridge; AND <--
23 PROVIDING FOR CPL. CARL F. HYNEK III MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

24 Section 2. Section 7 of the act is amended to read:

25 Section 7. Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr., Memorial
26 Highway.

27 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
28 follows:

29 (1) Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr., of
30 Fayetteville died while supporting combat operations in

1 Helmand Province, Afghanistan, on February 1, 2010, paying
2 the supreme sacrifice for his nation in Operation Enduring
3 Freedom.

4 (2) A 2008 graduate of Chambersburg Area High School,
5 Lance Corporal Freeman had served in the Marine Corps since
6 August 2008.

7 (3) Lance Corporal Freeman, a machine gunner assigned to
8 2nd Battalion, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary
9 Force in Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, had been on his first
10 deployment in Afghanistan since October 2009.

11 (4) Lance Corporal Freeman was awarded the Purple Heart,
12 Combat Action Ribbon and the Afghanistan Campaign Medal.

13 (b) Designation.--The section of [State Route 1001 from
14 Memorial Road to Mt. Pleasant Road in Greene Township,] U.S.
15 Route 30 in Franklin County from the eastern intersection with
16 State Route 1008 to the western intersection with State Route
17 1008, is designated the Lance Corporal Michael L. Freeman, Jr.,
18 Memorial Highway.

19 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
20 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
21 traffic in both directions on the highway.

22 SECTION 3. THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ: <--

23 SECTION 9.1. CPL. CARL F. HYNEK III MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

24 (A) FINDINGS.--

25 (1) CPL. CARL HYNEK WAS BORN AND RAISED IN UPPER
26 MORELAND TOWNSHIP, MONTGOMERY COUNTY.

27 (2) CPL. CARL HYNEK WAS DRAFTED INTO THE UNITED STATES
28 ARMY AFTER HIS HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION AND SERVED IN VIETNAM
29 WITH THE 101ST AIRBORNE DIVISION.

30 (3) CPL. CARL HYNEK WAS KILLED ON OCTOBER 5, 1967, IN

1 QUANG NAM, SOUTH VIETNAM, AT 22 YEARS OF AGE FROM WOUNDS HE
2 RECEIVED IN AN INTENSE FIREFIGHT WITH ENEMY FORCES.

3 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF STATE ROUTE 2044 IN
4 MONTGOMERY COUNTY FROM TERWOOD ROAD TO MORELAND ROAD IS HEREBY
5 DESIGNATED THE CPL. CARL F. HYNEK III MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.

6 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
7 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
8 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.

9 SECTION 4. REPEALS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

10 (1) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES THAT THE REPEAL UNDER
11 PARAGRAPH (2) IS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE ADDITION OF
12 SECTION 9.1 OF THE ACT.

13 (2) SECTION 6 OF THE ACT OF NOVEMBER 4, 2016 (P.L.1196,
14 NO.159), ENTITLED "AN ACT DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE
15 ROUTE 663 IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY AS THE ARMY SPECIALIST RAY IRA
16 HAAS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING THE PORTION OF STATE ROUTE
17 100 FROM HEREFORD TOWNSHIP AT THE LEHIGH COUNTY LINE THROUGH
18 WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP IN BERKS COUNTY AS THE FIRST LIEUTENANT
19 WILLIAM R. GENDEBIEN MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A PORTION
20 OF STATE ROUTE 2026, ALSO KNOWN AS BLAIR MILL ROAD, IN
21 MONTGOMERY COUNTY AS THE PRIVATE FIRST CLASS PAUL T. WRIGHT
22 MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON A PORTION OF SHEEP
23 BRIDGE ROAD OVER I-83, NEWBERRY TOWNSHIP, YORK COUNTY, AS THE
24 STAFF SGT. JASON M. FALEY MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A
25 BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 879 OVER TROUT RUN IN
26 GOSHEN TOWNSHIP, CLEARFIELD COUNTY, AS THE PRIVATE DAVID KYLE
27 MCCRACKEN MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE
28 ROUTE 2034 IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY AS THE CPL. CARL F. HYNEK III
29 MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 145 IN
30 SALISBURY TOWNSHIP, LEHIGH COUNTY, AS THE CPL. JOSHUA B.

1 SMITH MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION
2 OF U.S. ROUTE 15 OVER STATE ROUTE 114, UPPER ALLEN TOWNSHIP,
3 CUMBERLAND COUNTY, AS THE CPL. JONATHAN DEAN FAIRCLOTH
4 MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF BYBERRY ROAD
5 BETWEEN WARMINSTER ROAD AND ORANGEMEN'S ROAD IN MONTGOMERY
6 COUNTY AS THE MAJOR JEFFREY TOCZYLOWSKI MEMORIAL HIGHWAY;
7 DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 1010 IN BERKS COUNTY AS
8 THE DELIGHT BREIDEGAM, JR., MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A
9 PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 51 IN FAYETTE COUNTY AS THE OFFICER
10 RICHARD CHAMPION MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON
11 THAT PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 741 OVER THE CONESTOGA RIVER,
12 BETWEEN PEQUEA TOWNSHIP AND LANCASTER TOWNSHIP, LANCASTER
13 COUNTY, AS THE CPL. ERIC M. TORBERT, JR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE;
14 DESIGNATING THE INTERCHANGE OF STATE ROUTE 43, THE MON-
15 FAYETTE EXPRESSWAY, WITH RUBLES MILL ROAD, KNOWN AS EXIT 4,
16 FAYETTE COUNTY, AS THE MASTER SGT. ARTHUR L. LILLEY MEMORIAL
17 INTERCHANGE; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION OF STATE
18 ROUTE 770 OVER THE TUNUNGWANT CREEK, BRADFORD TOWNSHIP,
19 MCKEAN COUNTY, AS THE MASTER SGT. THOMAS MAHOLIC MEMORIAL
20 BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON THAT
21 PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 6 OVER DINGMAN RUN, COUDERSPORT
22 BOROUGH, POTTER COUNTY, AS THE PFC GEORGE PESOCK MEMORIAL
23 BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION OF STATE ROUTE
24 872 OVER BAILEY RUN IN WHARTON TOWNSHIP, POTTER COUNTY, AS
25 THE SGT. PAUL M. BROWN MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A CERTAIN
26 INTERCHANGE IN NEW STANTON BOROUGH, WESTMORELAND COUNTY, AS
27 THE E. JEFFREY WENTZEL MEMORIAL INTERCHANGE; DESIGNATING A
28 PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 220 IN LYCOMING AND SULLIVAN COUNTIES
29 AS THE LIEUTENANT COMMANDER JOHN J. PETERMAN MEMORIAL
30 HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 220 IN LYCOMING

1 COUNTY AS THE THOMAS A. PATERNOSTRO MEMORIAL HIGHWAY;
2 DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 1027 IN
3 POLK TOWNSHIP, JEFFERSON COUNTY, AS THE POLK TOWNSHIP
4 VETERANS MEMORIAL BRIDGE; AND MAKING RELATED REPEALS," IS
5 REPEALED.

6 SECTION 5. THE ADDITION OF SECTION 9.1 OF THE ACT SHALL BE
7 RETROACTIVE TO JANUARY 3, 2017.

8 Section ~~3~~ 6. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
