A RESOLUTION

- 1 Encouraging the medical community of this Commonwealth to help 2 raise awareness of unethical organ transplant practices in
- 3 China.
- 4 WHEREAS, Falun Gong is a spiritual practice with key values
- 5 of truthfulness, compassion and forbearance for achieving
- 6 physical and spiritual well-being through exercise and
- 7 meditation; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Since July 1999, Falun Gong practitioners have been
- 9 persecuted by the Chinese Communist Party, as documented by the
- 10 United States Department of State, the United States Commission
- 11 on International Religious Freedom, Amnesty International, Human
- 12 Rights Watch and many other governmental and third-party
- 13 organizations; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Persecution of Falun Gong practitioners involves the
- 15 widespread use of torture, forced labor work, brainwashing and
- 16 other abuses in extralegal reeducation-through-labor camps,
- 17 detention centers and prisons; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Prisoners are forced to undergo medical exams, blood

- 1 testing, urine testing and x-rays, despite being tortured; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The organ transplantation system in China does not
- 3 comply with the World Health Organization's requirement of
- 4 transparency and traceability in organ procurement pathways; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The People's Republic of China implemented
- 6 regulations in 1984 that permitted the harvesting of organs from
- 7 executed prisoners; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Former Vice Minister of Health, Huang Jiefu,
- 9 admitted publicly that more than 90% of transplant organs
- 10 extracted from deceased donors stemmed from executed prisoners
- 11 in China; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Organs were forcibly harvested from Falun Gong
- 13 practitioners in detention centers and prisons without
- 14 voluntary and informed consent; and
- WHEREAS, It is estimated that since 1999, more than 1 million
- 16 Falun Gong practitioners have been detained and that
- 17 approximately 65,000 Falun Gong practitioners have been killed
- 18 for their organs; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Hospitals receive organs from these prisons and the
- 20 harvested organs are then used for transplants; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Recipients for these transplants are Chinese or
- 22 individuals from abroad, including United States citizens; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Government of the People's Republic of China
- 24 continues to deny reports that many organs are taken without the
- 25 consent of prisoners, yet prevents independent verification of
- 26 its transplant system; and
- 27 WHEREAS, In June 2001, Chinese doctor Wang Guoqi testified
- 28 before the United States House of Representatives International
- 29 Relations Subcommittee on International Operations and Human
- 30 Rights that hospitals work in collusion with state security

- 1 agencies to extract organs from executed prisoners without
- 2 written consent of the organ donors and that these transplants
- 3 were a lucrative source of income; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The United States Department of State, in its 2011
- 5 Country Reports on Human Rights Practices stated, "Overseas and
- 6 domestic media and advocacy groups continued to report instances
- 7 of organ harvesting, particularly from Falun Gong practitioners
- 8 and Uighurs"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In May 2012, the World Organization to Investigate
- 10 the Persecution of Falun Gong released telephone transcripts and
- 11 audio recordings of conversations between undercover
- 12 investigators and senior Chinese Communist Party officials, in
- 13 which several officials indicated that central authorities were
- 14 aware of or involved in organ harvesting from Falun Gong
- 15 prisoners; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Voluntary and informed consent is the precondition
- 17 for ethical organ donation and international medical
- 18 organizations state that prisoners deprived of their freedom are
- 19 not in the position to give consent; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The practice of sourcing organs from prisoners is a
- 21 violation of ethical guidelines in medicine; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The killing of prisoners for the purpose of selling
- 23 their organs for transplant is an intolerable violation of the
- 24 fundamental right to life; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives call upon the
- 26 Government of the People's Republic of China to immediately end
- 27 the practice of forced organ harvesting from all prisoners,
- 28 particularly from Falun Gong prisoners and members of other
- 29 religious and ethnic minority groups; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives call upon the

- 1 Government of the People's Republic of China to increase
- 2 accountability and transparency in the organ transplant system
- 3 and punish those responsible for abuses; and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the United
- 5 States Government to commence a full and transparent
- 6 investigation into organ transplant practices in the People's
- 7 Republic of China; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives call upon the
- 9 United States Government to prohibit any doctors involved in
- 10 unethical organ procurement or transplantation surgery using
- 11 organs harvested from living prisoners in China from gaining
- 12 entry into the United States; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage the
- 14 medical community of this Commonwealth to help raise awareness
- 15 of unethical organ transplant practices in China.
