 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania National Guard's environmental office, staffed by both Pennsylvania National Guard members and
- 9 Department of Military and Veterans Affairs civilians won first
- 10 place in the Sustainability Team in the 2016 Army National Guard
- 11 Environmental Awards contest; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania National Guard and the Department
- 13 of Military and Veterans Affairs continuously strives to improve
- 14 environmental stewardship efforts while training for and
- 15 performing their Federal and State missions; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Bureau of Environmental Management is dedicated
- 17 to environmental excellence in supporting the missions of the
- 18 Department of Military and Veterans Affairs and the Pennsylvania

- 1 National Guard; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Fort Indiantown Gap is committed to compliance with
- 3 all Federal, State and local environmental laws and strives to
- 4 improve relationships with environmental regulators and the
- 5 community; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Whether it is soldiers preparing for overseas
- 7 deployments and state emergencies or focusing on natural
- 8 resource management and pollution control, the Department of
- 9 Military and Veterans Affairs considers the protection of the
- 10 environment as a priority; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania National Guard was able to recycle
- 12 more than 150,000 pounds of batteries as well as more than
- 13 225,000 pounds of brass. These initiatives helped both the
- 14 environment as well as providing nearly \$450,000 in revenue or
- 15 saved disposal costs; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Sustainability Team is constantly searching for
- 17 ways to minimize waste disposal and to expand waste diversion,
- 18 which benefits both the environment and the military; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Environmental protection sustains valuable training
- 20 areas, fosters community goodwill and prevents unnecessary
- 21 expenses; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Fort Indiantown Gap is committed to pollution
- 23 prevention and minimizing waste generation, especially hazardous
- 24 waste, through the efficient use of materials, effective
- 25 inventory management and careful planning; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Fort Indiantown Gap has established a collaborative
- 27 and productive working relationship with the Ward Burton
- 28 Wildlife Foundation and Capital Region Water for an easement of
- 29 8,200 acres of land that serves as a nature conservancy and a
- 30 key flight training route, thus protecting the critical main

- 1 water source for the City of Harrisburg; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Fort Indiantown Gap invites the public to tour Regal
- 3 Fritillary Butterfly habitats in areas normally closed to the
- 4 public to educate citizens on how the installation balances the
- 5 conservation efforts for this species with concern for military
- 6 training; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Bureau of Environmental Management handles
- 8 issues ranging from endangered species to cultural resources to
- 9 hazardous waste; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs
- 11 commits to continuously improving environmental performance in
- 12 concert with enhanced mission readiness, considers potential
- 13 environmental impacts of operational activities and individual
- 14 duties and minimizes impacts to the natural environment whenever
- 15 possible; therefore be it
