A RESOLUTION

1 2	Recognizing the month of April 2017 as "National Jazz Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, New Orleans is the birthplace of jazz music; and
4	WHEREAS, The history of jazz music is inextricably linked
5	with the history of African-American culture in the United
6	States; and
7	WHEREAS, Jazz has been called America's only true indigenous
8	art form; and
9	WHEREAS, Many musicians traveled north from New Orleans
10	during the First World War and brought the distinctive style of
11	jazz to Chicago, Washington, New York, Pittsburgh and
12	Philadelphia; and
13	WHEREAS, Langston Hughes, alumnus of Lincoln University,
14	extolled the virtues of jazz music in his famous poem, "Trumpet
15	Player: 52nd Street"; and
16	WHEREAS, Philadelphia and Pittsburgh made significant

contributions to jazz music in the early 20th century; and
WHEREAS, Philadelphia's South Street was home to the African American owned Standard and Dunbar theaters, both of which
hosted incredible performances by famous jazz musicians Bessie
Smith, Duke Ellington and Louis Armstrong; and

6 WHEREAS, Both Kenny Clark of Pittsburgh and John Coltrane of 7 Philadelphia helped shape the evolution of jazz music in America 8 and made significant contributions to the Bebop revolution; and 9 WHEREAS, Jazz music is uniquely American and represents one 10 of our nation's proudest cultural contributions to the world; 11 therefore be it
