A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the more than 171,000 veterans who served in World War  
2 II and continued to serve during the Korean Conflict and the  
3 Vietnam Conflict.

4 WHEREAS, World War II veterans served during the period of  
5 December 7, 1941, when the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor, to  
6 December 31, 1946; and

7 WHEREAS, The Korean Conflict took place from June 27, 1950,  
8 when President Harry S. Truman ordered troops to aid South  
9 Koreans during the invasion by North Korea, to January 31, 1955;  
10 and

11 WHEREAS, The Vietnam Conflict spanned from November 1, 1955,  
12 to May 15, 1975, following the Fall of Saigon to the North  
13 Vietnamese; and

14 WHEREAS, Approximately 38,000 veterans of all three of these

1 conflicts are still alive; and

2 WHEREAS, More than 800 veterans of these conflicts are living  
3 in Pennsylvania; and

4 WHEREAS, The continued selflessness and bravery that these  
5 veterans exhibited in keeping our country safe and protecting  
6 our freedoms shall be fully recognized; therefore be it

7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the more  
8 than 171,000 veterans who served in World War II and continued  
9 to serve during the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam Conflict;  
10 and be it further

11 RESOLVED, That today we rightly salute the accomplishments of  
12 the veterans of these three conflicts living in this  
13 Commonwealth.
