A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the week of June 4 through 10, 2017, as "Parental
- 2 Alienation and Hostile Aggressive Parenting Awareness Week"
- 3 in Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, "Parental Alienation and Hostile Aggressive
- 5 Parenting Awareness Week" is a Statewide effort aimed at raising
- 6 greater awareness about the adverse effects that parental
- 7 alienation and hostile aggressive parenting has on both the
- 8 psychological and emotional welfare of children; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Parental alienation (PA) is the process and result
- 10 of the psychological manipulation of a child into showing
- 11 unwarranted fear, disrespect or hostility toward a targeted
- 12 parent or other family member; and
- 13 WHEREAS, PA involves the programming of a child to align with
- 14 the favored parent as a means to meet emotional and
- 15 psychological needs; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The narcissistic or self-centered parent
- 17 manipulatively uses conditional displays of affection with

- 1 conditional displays of hostile rejection to coerce the child
- 2 into severing contact with the other parent; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The pathology of PA is a form of emotional and
- 4 psychological domestic violence whereby a narcissistic or self-
- 5 centered spouse or ex-spouse uses the child or children as a
- 6 weapon to inflict emotional trauma on the other spouse for any
- 7 perceived grievances; and
- 8 WHEREAS, PA represents a form of psychological child abuse
- 9 and is deserving of an appropriate child protection response;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, Parental alienation syndrome (PAS) is an abnormal
- 12 psychological condition most often observed in children affected
- 13 by high-conflict divorce or separation or during custody
- 14 modifications and is the result of exposure to hostile
- 15 aggressive parenting (HAP); and
- 16 WHEREAS, HAP is a general pattern of behavior, manipulation,
- 17 actions or decision-making of a person that either directly or
- 18 indirectly creates undue difficulties or interference in the
- 19 relationship between a child and the other parent; and
- 20 WHEREAS, HAP is not only limited to parents, but can also
- 21 apply to grandparents, extended family members or any other
- 22 person or agency having some control or influence over the
- 23 child; and
- 24 WHEREAS, A child reserves the basic and inherent right to be
- 25 a part of each parent's lives as each parent plays a vitally
- 26 important and integral role in the child's life; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Children should not be used as either weapons or
- 28 pawns; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Children should be provided with the mental and
- 30 emotional ability to love both parents and to be able to receive

- 1 the love of both parents in return; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts
- 3 (AOPC) is urged to offer nationally certified educational
- 4 information about the effects of PA and HAP as part of its
- 5 Judicial Education curriculum to be readily accessed by our
- 6 Commonwealth's family court judges; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Additional awareness about the issues of PA and HAP
- 8 will have a tremendous impact of both ending the abuse of
- 9 innocent children caught in the crossfire of spousal conflict
- 10 and edifying the minds of our Commonwealth's working-class
- 11 professionals, including judges, lawyers, psychiatrists,
- 12 teachers, and police officers, and the general populace; and
- 13 WHEREAS, In December 2005, the first "Parental Alienation and
- 14 Hostile Aggressive Parenting Awareness Day" was launched by
- 15 Sarvy Emo, a friend of a parent who was undergoing the effects
- 16 of PA and HAP; and
- 17 WHEREAS, In August 2006, Sarvy Emo, Robin Denison and Neil
- 18 Vercoe established the Parental Alienation Awareness
- 19 Organization (PASO) for the purpose of bringing education and
- 20 awareness to the issues of PA and HAP; and
- 21 WHEREAS, April 25, 2017, marked the 10th annual observance of
- 22 "Parental Alienation and Hostile Aggressive Parenting Awareness
- 23 Day," which was recognized both nationally and within this
- 24 Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 26 week of June 4 through 10, 2017, as "Parental Alienation and
- 27 Hostile Aggressive Parenting Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania;
- 28 and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all
- 30 Pennsylvanians to learn more about the concept and the adverse
