A RESOLUTION

- Urging the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania to require pro bono legal service as a condition of admission to the Pennsylvania Bar.
- 4 WHEREAS, The practice of law requires commitment to
- 5 individuals who lack resources to the legal system; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The pressing economic situation, nationally and in
- 7 this Commonwealth, has reduced access to legal services; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Rules 6.1 through 6.5 of the Rules of Professional
- 9 Conduct (relating to public service), encourage pro bono legal
- 10 service; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Specifically, Rule 6.1 of the Rules of Professional
- 12 Conduct provides that:
- 13 "A lawyer should render public interest legal service. A
- 14 lawyer may discharge this responsibility by providing
- 15 professional services at no fee or a reduced fee to persons of
- 16 limited means or to public service or charitable groups or
- 17 organizations, by service in activities for improving the law,
- 18 the legal system or the legal profession, and by financial

- 1 support for organizations that provide legal services to persons
- 2 of limited means";

- 4 WHEREAS, Applicants for admission to the Bar of the Supreme
- 5 Court of Pennsylvania will achieve educational and social value
- 6 by participating in pro bono legal service; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The State of New York has recently required pro bono
- 8 legal service of applicants for admission to the New York State
- 9 Bar; therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the Supreme
- 11 Court of Pennsylvania to amend Rule 203(b) of the Pennsylvania
- 12 Bar Admission Rules (relating to admission of graduates of
- 13 accredited and unaccredited institutions) by requiring up to 50
- 14 hours of supervised pro bono service in compliance with Rules
- 15 6.1 through 6.5 of the Rules of Professional Conduct; and be it
- 16 further

- 18 the Pennsylvania Board of Law Examiners.
