A RESOLUTION

1 Designating the month of September 2017 as "Sepsis Awareness
2 Month" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, Sepsis is a blood infection that attacks the body's
4 own tissues and organs and can lead to tissue damage, organ
5 failure and death; and

6 WHEREAS, Sepsis is the body's overwhelming and life-
7 threatening response to infection; and

8 WHEREAS, Sepsis affects an estimated 1.6 million people
9 annually; and

10 WHEREAS, Sepsis is one of the leading causes of death in the
11 United States, as more people are dying from sepsis than breast
12 cancer, prostate cancer and HIV/AIDS combined, and claims more
13 than 258,000 lives yearly; and

14 WHEREAS, Approximately 40% of patients diagnosed with severe
15 sepsis do not survive; and

1 WHEREAS, Approximately 50% of sepsis survivors suffer from
2 post-sepsis syndrome; and

3 WHEREAS, Sepsis significantly impacts at-risk populations,
4 elderly patients, young children and individuals who are
5 immunosuppressed; and

6 WHEREAS, Health care professionals and advocates consider
7 sepsis to be an epidemic, with one individual diagnosed every 20
8 seconds; and

9 WHEREAS, Sepsis is currently the third leading cause of
10 hospital admissions in Pennsylvania; and

11 WHEREAS, Sepsis was the most expensive in-patient cost in
12 hospitals throughout the United States in 2014, costing nearly
13 \$24 billion; and

14 WHEREAS, Health care professionals are combating sepsis
15 through early detection, best practices, new initiatives,
16 comprehensive education and defined data and analytics; and

17 WHEREAS, Early detection is the best hope for individuals
18 diagnosed with sepsis until a cure is found; and

19 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is proud to support health care
20 professionals, families and all those endeavoring to combat
21 sepsis; and

22 WHEREAS, In 2011, the Sepsis Alliance officially designated
23 September as "Sepsis Awareness Month" to highlight sepsis-
24 related information and resources around the globe; and

25 WHEREAS, In 2016, the Department of Health held the first
26 conference of its kind, Stopping Sepsis: Saving Lives in
27 Pennsylvania, which brought together more than 200 health care
28 leaders to discuss how Pennsylvania can combat sepsis; therefore
29 be it

30 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the

1 month of September 2017 as "Sepsis Awareness Month" in
2 Pennsylvania.
