INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, JANUARY 22, 2018

A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of January 2018 as "Amblyopia Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania. 2
- WHEREAS, Amblyopia can cause permanent vision loss if not 3
- identified and treated early in life; and 4
- 5 WHEREAS, The detection of amblyopia in early childhood
- increases the chances of successful treatment, especially if the 6
- 7 disorder is detected before a child reaches five years of age;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, Many forms of amblyopia are difficult to detect and
- can be identified only through proper screening techniques; and 10
- 11 WHEREAS, The earlier children are identified as having
- 12 amblyopia, the sooner treatment can commence; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Fewer than 20% of preschool children are currently
- 14 being screened for vision problems, even though screening is a
- service covered by many health insurance plans and health 15
- 16 maintenance organizations; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Parents should be encouraged to have their children
- 2 screened for vision problems prior to admission to preschool;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Academy of Ophthalmology and a
- 5 number of Statewide associations, charitable organizations,
- 6 State agencies and local public health departments believe that
- 7 it is of paramount importance to promote Statewide preschool
- 8 vision screening, with the goal of testing all children between
- 9 three and five years of age; therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 11 month of January 2018 as "Amblyopia Awareness Month" in
- 12 Pennsylvania.
