A RESOLUTION

1 2	Recognizing February 27, 2018, as "World Spay Day" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Cats, dogs and other animals possess unique
4	personalities and provide faithful companionship for many
5	Pennsylvanians; and
6	WHEREAS, Not all owners of these companion animals have their
7	pets spayed or neutered, which allows for the birth of unwanted
8	animals; and
9	WHEREAS, According to the American Society for the Prevention
10	of Cruelty to Animals, approximately 6.5 million animals enter
11	shelters each year in our country; and
12	WHEREAS, Approximately half of these animals are adopted to
13	new homes, while tragically many are euthanized; and
14	WHEREAS, The overwhelming majority of euthanized animals are
15	healthy and adoptable, yet still meet an untimely death because
16	insufficient resources exist to keep them alive until a suitable

1 home can be found; and

2 WHEREAS, Pet overpopulation costs public and private entities 3 millions of dollars annually through the implementation of 4 animal control and sheltering programs; and

5 WHEREAS, The practice of having a pet spayed or neutered at 6 the expense of the owner or through a subsidized spay and neuter 7 program has proven to be highly successful in addressing pet 8 overpopulation; and

9 WHEREAS, In an effort to promote the important role that 10 spaying and neutering can play in controlling pet 11 overpopulation, "Spay Day USA" was created in 1995 by the Doris 12 Day Animal League; and

13 WHEREAS, "World Spay Day" is now a program of the Humane 14 Society of the United States, Humane Society International and 15 Humane Society Veterinary Medical Association; and

16 WHEREAS, The continued observance of this day by a growing 17 number of public and private entities throughout the world in 18 each successive year has greatly increased the awareness and 19 efficacy of spaying and neutering as a means to control pet 20 overpopulation; and

21 WHEREAS, Veterinarians, national and local animal protection 22 organizations and private citizens once again join together in 23 2018 to advocate for spaying and neutering on "World Spay Day"; 24 therefore be it

25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize February 26 27, 2018, as "World Spay Day" in Pennsylvania and encourage 27 Pennsylvanians to have their pets spayed or neutered and support 28 programs in their communities that offer spay and neuter 29 services.
