INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, MARCH 9, 2018

A RESOLUTION

Recognizing March 22, 2018, as "World Water Day" in Pennsylvania in conjunction with the 2018 "World Water Day" international 2 observance designated by the General Assembly of the United 3 Nations. 4 5 WHEREAS, Access to water is a fundamental human need; and 6 WHEREAS, Safe drinking water, sanitation and hygiene prevent disease and save children's lives; and 8 WHEREAS, Water scarcity and water shortages impact billions 9 of lives worldwide; and 10 WHEREAS, In developing countries, where water collection can consume 25% of the day, 1.3 billion people are gaining access to 11 12 safe drinking water through initiatives of the United Nations and other global entities; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Public and private entities across all continents 15 must pursue unified water conservation work and continued 16 investment in water infrastructure to make further progress; and 17 WHEREAS, The first "World Water Day" observance stemmed from

- 1 the 1992 United Nations Conference on Environment and
- 2 Development; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The 2018 "World Water Day" observance is focusing on
- 4 nature-based solutions to the water challenges the world faces
- 5 in the 21st century; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The theme for 2018 "World Water Day" is "Nature for
- 7 Water"; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The central message for this year's celebration is
- 9 that nature-based solutions, including planting trees to
- 10 replenish forests, reconnecting rivers to floodplains and
- 11 restoring wetlands, forests and grasslands, are sustainable and
- 12 cost-effective ways to rebalance the water cycle, mitigate the
- 13 effects of climate change and improve human health and
- 14 livelihoods; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Nature-based solutions can produce benefits beyond
- 16 water-related services, such as providing biomass for energy
- 17 production, improving biodiversity and creating recreational
- 18 spaces and job opportunities; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Countries around the world will hold panel
- 20 discussions, forums, family events, cleanup events, rafting and
- 21 kayaking trips, expositions, festivals and contests to celebrate
- 22 "World Water Day," explore innovative nature-based solutions and
- 23 recognize the precious resource on which all living creatures
- 24 depend; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives affirms that clean
- 26 water resources are essential to maintaining human health and
- 27 environmental integrity, alleviating poverty and hunger and
- 28 instituting global sustainable development; and
- 29 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives notes that water
- 30 quantity, water quality and equal access to water resources

- 1 positively impacts homes and workplaces and drives socioeconomic
- 2 transformation; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize March
- 4 22, 2018, as "World Water Day" in Pennsylvania in conjunction
- 5 with the 2018 "World Water Day" international observance
- 6 designated by the General Assembly of the United Nations.
