A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing May 12, 2018, as "Myalgic Encephalomyelitis/Chronic Fatigue Syndrome Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Myalgic encephalomyelitis (ME), commonly referred to
- 4 as chronic fatigue syndrome (ME/CFS), is a disorder
- 5 characterized by a substantial disability that affects daily
- 6 activities and profound fatigue that is not relieved by rest;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Symptoms of ME/CFS include severe fatigue,
- 9 unrefreshing sleep, problems thinking and concentrating, muscle
- 10 and joint pain and worsened memory; and
- 11 WHEREAS, ME/CFS may get worse after any physical or mental
- 12 activity, due to a symptom known as postexertional malaise; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Although it is most common in women and people
- 14 between 40 and 60 years of age, ME/CFS affects people of all
- 15 ages, races and ethnicities; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Researchers estimate that anywhere between 836,000

- 1 and 2.5 million Americans suffer from ME/CFS, but only an
- 2 estimated 10% have been correctly diagnosed; and
- 3 WHEREAS, ME/CFS is often misdiagnosed or left undiagnosed due
- 4 to the fact that there is no test to confirm it; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The symptoms of ME/CFS appear similar to those of
- 6 many other illnesses; and
- WHEREAS, ME/CFS may make it hard to maintain employment, go
- 8 to school and take part in family and social life; and
- 9 WHEREAS, ME/CFS costs the United States economy approximately
- 10 \$17 to \$24 billion annually in medical bills and lost incomes;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, The cause of ME/CFS is unknown; and
- 13 WHEREAS, There is no known cure, but certain ME/CFS symptoms
- 14 may be treated or managed; and
- 15 WHEREAS, May 12 has been recognized as "Myalgic
- 16 Encephalomyelitis/Chronic Fatigue Syndrome Awareness Day" in
- 17 honor of Florence Nightingale, who was believed to have suffered
- 18 from this disorder; and
- 19 WHEREAS, "Myalgic Encephalomyelitis/Chronic Fatigue Syndrome
- 20 Awareness Day" is observed around the world to bring awareness
- 21 to patients with the disorder as well as families, caregivers
- 22 and researchers who work with or have been impacted by this
- 23 disorder; therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize May 12,
- 25 2018, as "Myalgic Encephalomyelitis/Chronic Fatigue Syndrome
- 26 Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania and support efforts to find a
- 27 cure.
