A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of May 2018 as "Mental Health Awareness in the Black Community Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Persistent racial inequality and race-based
- 4 exclusion in the United States has translated into continuing
- 5 mental health disparities among African Americans and a
- 6 continuing mental health care gap; and
- 7 WHEREAS, African Americans are disproportionately affected by
- 8 serious psychological distress and mental health disorders; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Twenty-five percent of African Americans seek and
- 10 access mental health services as compared to 40% of individuals
- 11 representing other racial groups; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The American Psychological Association has reported
- 13 that young adult African Americans who have acquired higher
- 14 levels of education are less likely than other young adults to
- 15 seek mental health services; and
- 16 WHEREAS, African Americans receive low rates of outpatient

- 1 care and high rates of emergency care; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Disparities in mental health outcomes exist even
- 3 after access to the health care system has been improved; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The inaugural Black Brain Campaign in 2016 spurred
- 5 Philadelphia-area clinicians to explore mental health reforms
- 6 for African Americans; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Marriage and family therapists Jaynay Johnson and
- 8 Farida Saleem-Boyer established the Black Brain Campaign to
- 9 strengthen families within the African-American community; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The structure provided by a cohesive family and
- 11 extended family is essential in confronting racial disparities,
- 12 transcending cultural and bureaucratic barriers and reducing
- 13 stigmas and discrimination; and
- 14 WHEREAS, School-based counselors and community-based
- 15 counselors are also essential in coordinating available mental
- 16 health resources and addressing the silence and the fears that
- 17 can perpetuate cycles of trauma; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Other mental health professionals, health care
- 19 providers and social service providers are vital in confronting
- 20 provider bias where it exists; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Health policy experts and advocates are also
- 22 important to close the racial gaps in mental health status and
- 23 mental health care; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives recognizes an
- 25 imperative for health care policy reforms, interventions and
- 26 initiatives to eliminate mental health disparities based on
- 27 race, ethnicity, education, income or geography; therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 29 month of May 2018 as "Mental Health Awareness in the Black
- 30 Community Month" in Pennsylvania.
