A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the month of June 2018 as "LGBT Pride Month" in 1 Pennsylvania. 2 3 WHEREAS, Our Commonwealth was founded on the principles of 4 freedom, fairness and tolerance; and 5 WHEREAS, Through military service, in debates and 6 demonstrations, at the polls and in countless other acts of 7 democracy, Pennsylvanians have consistently defended these 8 principles; and WHEREAS, Many lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) 9 10 Pennsylvanians and their allies have had significant roles in 11 the economic, cultural, spiritual and political development of 12 this Commonwealth while working tirelessly to maintain and 13 promote culture and history; and 14 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has been the site of many pivotal

15 moments in LGBT history; and

WHEREAS, The activism that has been vital for promoting
tolerance and acceptance of the LGBT community has flourished in
this Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, In May 1965, borrowing a strategy associated with the African-American civil rights movement, a group of gender variant persons of color organized a sit-in to protest discrimination toward LGBT individuals at Dewey's lunch counter in Philadelphia; and

9 WHEREAS, This event has been recognized as the first LGBT 10 sit-in in the nation and one of the first demonstrations 11 launched with the goal of protecting the dignity of LGBT 12 individuals; and

13 WHEREAS, The Annual Reminder marches held in front of the 14 Liberty Bell on Independence Day from 1965 through 1969 drew 15 national attention to the LGBT community's struggle for liberty 16 and equality; and

WHEREAS, Initiatives in keeping with the Dewey's lunch counter and Annual Reminder demonstrations have generated greater inclusion among LGBT Americans in their respective communities; and

21 WHEREAS, Commonwealth agencies and officers have 22 traditionally been on the forefront of LGBT recognition, 23 regardless of which political party has been in control; and 24 WHEREAS, In 1975, Governor Milton Shapp issued the first 25 Statewide resolution in the nation recognizing LGBT equality; 26 and

27 WHEREAS, In 1976, Governor Shapp established the Pennsylvania 28 Council for Sexual Minorities, the first governmental body in 29 the nation to examine LGBT issues; and

30 WHEREAS, In 1979, Governor Richard Thornburgh became the

1 first Republican governor in the nation to issue a Statewide 2 resolution recognizing LGBT equality; and

3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians remain committed to advancing LGBT4 inclusion and quality of life; and

5 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth is home to *Philadelphia Gay News*, 6 the oldest continually published magazine devoted to LGBT 7 issues; and

8 WHEREAS, The John C. Anderson Apartments in Philadelphia, one 9 of the nation's first affordable LGBT elder housing facilities, 10 and the Persad Center in Pittsburgh, the second oldest licensed 11 counseling center serving the LGBT community and people living 12 with HIV, offer additional resources; and

13 WHEREAS, The month of June is recognized worldwide as "LGBT 14 Pride Month" to commemorate the Stonewall riots in New York 15 City, considered to be a turning point in the fight for global 16 LGBT equality; and

WHEREAS, "LGBT Pride Month" highlights the work, struggles, accomplishments and challenges of LGBT individuals in this Commonwealth and beyond; and

20 WHEREAS, As a celebration of diversity, "LGBT Pride Month" 21 reflects our State's unique history of welcoming and securing 22 equal treatment for all individuals and adds greatly to the 23 social inclusion and economic health and well-being of our 24 communities; therefore be it

25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the 26 month of June 2018 as "LGBT Pride Month" in Pennsylvania.
