A RESOLUTION

- Observing the month of September 2018 as "Newborn Screening Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Newborn screening is the practice of screening every
- 4 newborn for certain harmful or potentially fatal conditions that
- 5 are not otherwise apparent at birth; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Early detection of these conditions in newborns
- 7 facilitates timely interventions that result in significant
- 8 decreases in morbidity, mortality and disability; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Newborn screening is a comprehensive system that
- 10 includes testing, diagnosis, follow-up, treatment, education and
- 11 evaluation; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Every year nearly 4.1 million newborns in the United
- 13 States and more than 140,000 newborns in Pennsylvania undergo
- 14 newborn screening; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Newborn screening was recently named in the Centers

- 1 for Disease Control and Prevention's list of Ten Great Public
- 2 Health Achievements in the 20th Century; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Newborn screening began in 1963 in the United States
- 4 with testing for phenylketonuria (PKU); and
- 5 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania began newborn screening with the act of
- 6 September 9, 1965 (P.L.497, No.251), known as the Newborn Child
- 7 Testing Act, by requiring physicians, hospitals and other
- 8 institutions to administer tests or cause tests to be
- 9 administered for PKU and other metabolic diseases upon infants
- 10 in certain cases; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Since first enacted in 1965, the Newborn Child
- 12 Testing Act has been amended three times, most recently with Act
- 13 148 of 2014, which expanded the list of required diseases for
- 14 testing from 6 to 12; and
- 15 WHEREAS, In addition to the required testing, Pennsylvania
- 16 provides newborn hearing screening, testing for critical
- 17 congenital heart disease and follow-up screening and services
- 18 for other diseases; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth's Newborn Screening and Follow-up
- 20 Program is administered by the Pennsylvania Department of
- 21 Health; and
- 22 WHEREAS, "Newborn Screening Awareness Month" was started in
- 23 2000 by the Save Babies Through Screening Foundation, along with
- 24 several partner organizations, to shine a national spotlight on
- 25 newborn screening and its detectable diseases; therefore be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives observe the month
- 27 of September 2018 as "Newborn Screening Awareness Month" in
- 28 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth officially recognize the
- 30 importance of awareness of newborn screening and encourage

- 1 parents and future parents to educate themselves and take the
- 2 necessary steps to ensure the health of their children.
