4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:

5	<u>§ 9801. Definitions.</u>
6	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
7	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
8	context clearly indicates otherwise:
9	"Institution of higher education." Any institution of higher <
10	learning that is approved by the Pennsylvania Higher Education
11	Assistance Agency to participate in the award of State grants
12	under the act of January 25, 1966 (1965 P.L.1546, No.541),
13	referred to as the Higher Education Scholarship Law. ANY OF THE <
14	FOLLOWING:
15	(1) A COMMUNITY COLLEGE OPERATING UNDER ARTICLE XIX-A OF
16	THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 (P.L.30, NO.14), KNOWN AS THE
17	PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF 1949.
18	(2) A UNIVERSITY WITHIN THE STATE SYSTEM OF HIGHER
19	EDUCATION UNDER ARTICLE XX-A OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF
20	<u>1949.</u>
21	(3) A STATE-RELATED INSTITUTION AS DEFINED IN SECTION
22	1502-A OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CODE OF 1949.
23	(4) THADDEUS STEVENS COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY.
24	(5) ANY ACCREDITED PRIVATE OR INDEPENDENT COLLEGE OR
25	UNIVERSITY.
26	"Program." The Keystone State Challenge Academy established
27	under section 9802 (relating to program established).
28	"School entity." A school district, charter school, cyber_
29	charter school, regional charter school, intermediate unit or
30	area vocational-technical school.

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1 <u>§ 9802. Program established.</u>

2	To the extent funds are appropriated for the purposes
3	provided under this chapter, the department shall establish a
4	<u>youth challenge program as provided for under 32 U.S.C. § 509</u>
5	(relating to National Guard Youth Challenge Program of
6	opportunities for civilian youth). The program shall be known as
7	the Keystone State Challenge Academy.
8	<u>§ 9803. Description of program.</u>
9	(A) GENERAL RULETHE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP PROGRAM <
10	GUIDELINES IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.
11	<u>Consistent with 32 U.S.C. § 509(a) (relating to National Guard</u>
12	Youth Challenge Program of opportunities for civilian youth),
13	the program shall seek to improve the life skills and employment
14	potential of participants by providing military-based training
15	and supervised work experience, together with the core program
16	components of assisting participants to receive a high school
17	diploma or its equivalent; leadership development; promoting
18	fellowship and community service; developing life coping skills
19	and job skills; and improving physical fitness and health and
20	hygiene. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL POST THE PROGRAM GUIDELINES ON THE <
21	HOME PAGE OF THE DEPARTMENT'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET
22	WEBSITE AND SHALL PROVIDE THE GUIDELINES TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
23	EDUCATION.
24	(B) DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATIONTHE DEPARTMENT OF
25	EDUCATION SHALL POST THE PROGRAM GUIDELINES ON THE HOME PAGE OF
26	THE DEPARTMENT'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE AND SHALL
27	ANNUALLY DISTRIBUTE THE GUIDELINES AND RELEVANT PROGRAM
28	INFORMATION TO ALL SCHOOL ENTITIES.
29	§ 9804. Length of program.
30	The program shall be for a period of time as set forth in 32

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1	U.S.C. § 509(a) (relating to National Guard Youth Challenge
2	Program of opportunities for civilian youth).
3	<u>§ 9805. Participants.</u>
4	Requirements for participation in the program shall be as
5	prescribed by the United States Secretary of Defense under 32
6	<u>U.S.C. § 509(e) (relating to National Guard Youth Challenge</u>
7	Program of opportunities for civilian youth).
8	<u>§ 9806. Administration.</u>
9	Subject to 32 U.S.C. § 509 (relating to National Guard Youth
10	Challenge Program of opportunities for civilian youth) and its
11	implementing regulations and applicable agreements, the program
12	shall be staffed by the administrative, professional, technical
13	and clerical employees necessary for the operation of the
14	program.
15	<u>§ 9807. Funding.</u>
16	The department shall apply for funding, as provided for under
17	32 U.S.C. § 509(d) (relating to National Guard Youth Challenge
18	<u>Program of opportunities for civilian youth). Under 32 U.S.C. §</u>
19	509(j), the department may supplement the funding with other
20	resources, including gifts, made available to the department and
21	may also accept, use and dispose of gifts or donations of money,
22	other property or services for the program.
23	<u>§ 9808. Transferability of course credit.</u>
24	All academic course credits earned by a program participant
25	shall be recognized by any school entity in which the
26	participant enrolls following completion of the program. The
27	department, in consultation with the Department of Education,
28	shall ensure that the program complies with all statutory and
29	regulatory provisions as necessary to facilitate the
30	transferability of course credit earned in the program to a
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1	<u>school entity.</u>
2	<u>§ 9809. Advisory council.</u>
3	(a) EstablishmentAn advisory council is established for
4	the program. The advisory council shall consist of the following
5	members and the Adjutant General, who shall serve as a
6	nonvoting, ex officio member. Members of the advisory council
7	shall be appointed as follows:
8	(1) Three members appointed by the Governor as follows:
9	(i) The Deputy Adjutant General for Army or a
10	<u>designee.</u>
11	(ii) The Deputy Adjutant General for Air or a
12	<u>designee.</u>
13	(iii) The Secretary of Education or a designee.
14	(2) Three members of the Senate appointed by the
15	President pro tempore of the Senate, in consultation with the
16	Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the Senate, with two
17	appointees from the majority party and one appointee from the
18	minority party.
19	(3) Three members of the House of Representatives
20	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, in
21	consultation with the Majority Leader and Minority Leader of
22	the House of Representatives, with two appointees from the
23	majority party and one appointee from the minority party.
24	(b) TermsEach member of the advisory council shall serve
25	for the duration of the term of the appointing authority,
26	provided that each member may be removed for cause by the
27	member's appointing authority.
28	(c) ChairpersonThe advisory council shall annually elect
29	<u>a chairperson.</u>
30	(d) QuorumFive members of the advisory council shall
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1	<u>constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting the business</u>
2	of the advisory council. The advisory council shall meet at
3	least quarterly and at other times at the call of the
4	<u>chairperson.</u>
5	(e) CompensationMembers of the advisory council shall
6	receive no compensation for their services but shall receive
7	reimbursement for their necessary and proper expenses for
8	attendance at meetings.
9	(f) Program operationThe advisory council shall advise
10	the Adjutant General and the department concerning the operation
11	<u>of the program.</u>
12	<u>§ 9810. Report.</u>
13	(a) Annual reportThe department shall prepare annually a
14	written report concerning the program. The report shall include,
15	but not be limited to, all of the following:
16	(1) The number of individuals who applied to the program
17	in the previous fiscal year.
18	(2) The number of individuals who participated in the
19	program in the previous fiscal year.
20	(3) The number and percentage of program participants in
21	the previous fiscal year who achieved each of the following:
22	(i) Earned a high school diploma or its equivalent.
23	(ii) Enrolled in a course of study at an institution
24	of higher education.
25	(iii) Accepted a position of full-time, paid
26	employment.
27	(iv) Accepted a position of part-time, paid
28	employment.
29	(v) Entered the armed forces of the United States,
30	including a reserve component or the National Guard.

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1	(4) The demographic makeup of the applicants to and
2	participants in the program, including, but not limited to,
3	the following:
4	(i) Race.
5	(ii) Age.
6	<u>(iii) Gender.</u>
7	(5) Any information the department provides to the
8	Secretary of Defense under 32 U.S.C. § 509(k) (relating to
9	National Guard Youth Challenge Program of opportunities for
10	<u>civilian youth).</u>
11	(b) SubmissionThe report shall be submitted to the
12	following:
13	(1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
14	Education Committee of the Senate.
15	(2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
16	Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the
17	Senate.
18	(3) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
19	Education Committee of the House of Representatives.
20	(4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
21	Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the
22	House of Representatives.
23	<u>§ 9811. Audit required.</u>
24	The department shall submit annually to the chairperson and <
25	minority chairperson of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
26	Preparedness Committee of the Senate and the chairperson and
27	minority chairperson of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
28	Preparedness Committee of the House of Representatives a
29	complete certified audit of the program. The audit shall be
30	conducted by a qualified independent certified public accountant
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1	under generally accepted audit standards of the Governmental
2	Accounting Standards Board. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL UNDERGO AN <
3	ANNUAL AUDIT OF THE PROGRAM. THE AUDIT SHALL BE CONDUCTED BY A
4	QUALIFIED INDEPENDENT CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT UNDER
5	GENERALLY ACCEPTED AUDIT STANDARDS OF THE GOVERNMENTAL
6	ACCOUNTING STANDARDS BOARD. THE AUDIT SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE
7	FOLLOWING:
8	(1) THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
9	EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE.
10	(2) THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
11	VETERANS AFFAIRS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE OF THE
12	SENATE.
13	(3) THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
14	EDUCATION COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
15	(4) THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
16	VETERANS AFFAIRS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE OF THE
17	HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
