AN ACT

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 22 (Detectives and 1 Private Police) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in 2 riot, disorderly conduct and related offenses, further 3 providing for the offense of cruelty to animals; and, in humane society police officers, further providing for Humane 5 Society Police Officer Advisory Board. 6 7 This act shall be referred to as Cordelia's Law. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 5511(a)(2.1) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 11 12 § 5511. Cruelty to animals. 13 Killing, maiming or poisoning domestic animals or zoo 14 animals, etc. --* * * 15 16 (i) A person commits a misdemeanor of the first 17 degree if he willfully and maliciously: Kills, maims, mutilates, tortures or 18 (A) 19 disfigures any dog [or], cat or equine animal,

whether belonging to himself or otherwise. [If a person kills, maims, mutilates, tortures or disfigures a dog quide for an individual who is blind, a hearing dog for an individual who is deaf or audibly impaired or a service dog for an individual who is physically limited, whether belonging to the individual or otherwise, that person, in addition to any other applicable penalty, shall be required to make reparations for veterinary costs in treating the dog and, if necessary, the cost of obtaining and training a replacement dog.]

- (B) Administers poison to or exposes any poisonous substance with the intent to administer such poison to any dog [or], cat or equine animal, whether belonging to himself or otherwise.
- (ii) Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this paragraph shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$1,000 or to imprisonment for not more than two years, or both. The court may also order a presentence mental evaluation. A subsequent conviction under this paragraph shall be a felony of the third degree. [This paragraph shall apply to dogs and cats only.]
- (iii) The killing of a dog [or], cat or equine animal by the owner of that animal is not malicious if it is accomplished in accordance with the act of December 22, 1983 (P.L.303, No.83), referred to as the Animal Destruction Method Authorization Law.
- (iv) If a person kills, maims, mutilates, tortures or disfigures a quide dog for an individual who is blind,

10	include any of the following, unless directed to be
11	performed by a licensed veterinarian:

14	(B) inflicting severe and prolonged pain from
15	burning, crushing or wounding; or
16	(C) causing or allowing, through prolonged
17	deprivation of food or sustenance, a substantial loss
18	in the animal's appropriate body mass without
19	veterinary care.

25	(g) Development of guidelines On or before December 31,
26	2017, the board shall develop guidelines to assist humane
27	society police officers, law enforcement officers, the courts
28	and the department in the implementation and enforcement of both
29	this chapter and 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511 (relating to cruelty to
30	animals). The guidelines shall, at a minimum, include the

- 2 <u>existence of:</u>
- 3 (1) torture and other violations of 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511;

- 5 (2) the necessary probable cause to support seizure or
- 6 <u>impoundment of animals.</u>
- 7 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
