AN ACT

1 Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937  
2 P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of  
3 unemployment compensation to be administered by the  
4 Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly  
5 created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions)  
6 selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to  
7 keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay  
8 contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the  
9 payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons;  
10 providing procedure and administrative details for the  
11 determination, payment and collection of such contributions  
12 and the payment of such compensation; providing for  
13 cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies;  
14 creating certain special funds in the custody of the State  
15 Treasurer; and prescribing penalties," in compensation,  
16 further providing for duties of employers.

17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
18 hereby enacts as follows:

19 Section 1. Section 405 of the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd  
20 Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment  
21 Compensation Law, is amended to read:

22 Section 405. Duties of Employers and Persons Offering  
23 Certain Employment.--(a) Each employer shall post in a  
24 conspicuous place, or places, in his establishment, or  
25 establishments, any printed statement or notice required by the

1 rules and regulations of the department.

2 (b) A person who offers to an individual any employment as  
3 enumerated in section 4(1)(4) of this act shall, unless the  
4 person elects to include the employment under section 4(j)(6) of  
5 this act, notify the individual that the employment is exempt  
6 under this act and that the individual will be ineligible for  
7 unemployment compensation benefits.

8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
